

1999 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 25

November 4, 1999 – Introduced by Senators DRZEWIECKI, BRESKE, ROESSLER, ROBSON, RUDE, DARLING, PLACHE, GROBSCHMIDT and ROSENZWEIG, cosponsored by Representatives HAHN, HUEBSCH, KLUSMAN, DUFF, HEBL, BOCK, MUSSER, SUDER, NASS, OWENS, HASENOHRL, RYBA, URBAN, PETTIS, LADWIG, RHOADES, KAUFERT, FREESE, STASKUNAS, MORRIS-TATUM, SYKORA, SKINDRUD, J. LEHMAN and KELSO. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1 **Relating to:** declaring November as Diabetes Awareness Month.

2 Whereas, diabetes is the 7th leading cause of death in the United States; and

3 Whereas, diabetes is the leading cause of new cases of blindness, and
4 individuals with diabetes are at a much greater risk of developing kidney disease,
5 heart disease and stroke; and

6 Whereas, pregnant women with diabetes face a greater chance of delivering a
7 baby with birth defects, and the newborn is 2 to 3 times more likely to die within the
8 first month; and

9 Whereas, health care and other costs directly resulting from diabetes are
10 extremely high, about \$92 billion annually, making diabetes one of the most costly
11 health problems in America today; and

12 Whereas, approximately 2,200 people are diagnosed daily with diabetes, while
13 an alarming 5.4 million people nationwide are not yet aware they have the disease;
