**1999 ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 28**

March 21, 2000 - Introduced by Representative JESKEWITZ, by request of Department of Financial Institutions. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **Relating to:** proclaiming April 2000 as "Savings and Investing Month" in this state.

2       Whereas, saving and investing are essential to the financial stability of all  
3 citizens of this state; and

4       Whereas, the citizens of this state should make well-informed, educated  
5 decisions about where and how they save and invest their personal income; and

6       Whereas, through the Your Money Matters financial education program, the  
7 department of financial institutions seeks to teach the citizens of this state the basics  
8 of saving and investing and the importance of creating personal wealth through a  
9 saving and investment plan; and

10       Whereas, the department of financial institutions, along with its national  
11 partners, has developed the Financial Literacy 2001 program, which is provided free  
12 of charge to teachers and schools for use in teaching financial responsibility to the  
13 school children of this state; and

14       Whereas, the department of financial institutions, in association with the  
15 Wisconsin Council on Economic Education, has used the Stock Market Game to

1 better educate children in grades 4 to 12 on how economic markets work and on the  
2 impact that the stock market has on our daily lives; and

3 Whereas, it is the responsibility of every individual to learn the facts of saving  
4 and investing, take charge of his or her money, realize the importance of saving for  
5 his or her family's future, investigate securities and the companies and brokers that  
6 sell them before investing, and understand that it is never too late to invest; and

7 Whereas, during the month of April 2000, state and federal agencies, securities  
8 regulators, consumer groups, the financial industry and the media will join together  
9 to conduct educational events in schools and communities to illustrate the  
10 importance of personal financial ownership; now, therefore, be it

11 *Resolved by the ~~assembly~~ <sup>senate</sup> That* the members of the Wisconsin ~~assembly~~ <sup>senate</sup>  
12 declare April 2000 as "Saving and Investing Month", and call on the citizens of this  
13 state to observe this declaration through participation in programs and activities to  
14 improve their financial futures; and, be it further

15 *Resolved, That,* during this month and throughout the year, the department  
16 of financial institutions will conduct activities to educate the citizens of this state on  
17 the importance of saving and investing.

If you choose to introduce the proposal without the fiscal estimate, the fiscal estimate will be requested automatically upon introduction. It takes about 10 days to obtain a fiscal estimate. Requesting the fiscal estimate prior to introduction retains your flexibility for possible redrafting of the proposal.
