7. AGRICHEMICAL FEE REDUCTION

EXPLANATION:

The department currently collects license and tonnage fees for agricultural inputs, including pesticides, fertilizer and feed. Fees are used to fund the department's agrichemical management program. Fee surcharges are also used to fund an agricultural chemical cleanup program.

The department currently has a surplus of funds in its agrichemical management and ag chem cleanup accounts. The 1997-99 biennial budget act therefore reduced license and tonnage fees for FY 1997-98 and FY 1998-1999. The department is proposing legislation to extend this fee reduction for one more year (FY 1999-2000).

The 1997-99 biennial budget act also created a 2-year "fee holiday" for agricultural chemical cleanup surcharges. Surcharges will revert to their prior levels at the end of the 2-year "fee holiday" unless the department extends the "fee holiday" by rule. The department plans to extend this "fee holiday" for one more year. The department can extend this "fee holiday" by rule, without further legislation.



Current law imposes fees on meter owners for not complying with these registration and testing requirements and on meter servicing companies for not complying with the reporting requirements. The bill makes minor changes in these fees.
