### DEFINE PROBLEM PRECISELY

- 1) 1997 WI Act 84, changes the entire driver licensing withdrawal process. The effective date to implement Act 84 is May 1, 2000. DMV/BAS does not have the resources to complete system changes necessary to implement Act 84 at date. We can implement some of the changes that require minimal or no systems work by January 1, 2000. These changes are listed on the attached sheet (Act 84 No DP changes needed). We are requesting the remainder of Act 84 be effective May 1, 2001 with the ability of the Secretary to certify that specific changes are ready to be implemented sooner.
- 2) Corrective changes necessary to implement Act 84:.
- (A) The effective date of s.343.44(2) should have been the "first day of the 13th month AFTER the effective date of the Act" (May 1, 2002). This will make all OAR convictions civil offenses for the first year only and keep them out of circuit court All OAR convictions after May 1, 2002 will be criminal and must be prosecuted in circuit court.
- (B) The change to amend 351.02(1)(a)10 is a technical correction. The reference to 6-303 was stricken in this section, but the descriptive language associated with 6-303 was not.
- (C) Section 70 of Act 84 The penalty for OWS (343.44(2)(a)) did not include local ordinance violations. This needs to be corrected.
- 3) The habitual traffic offender (HTO) revocation effective date is not consistent. Presently persons who surrender their drivers license are revoked effective on the date of the surrender, while others are effective on the date of the order. It is often difficult and labor intensive to track down the date of surrender (if there is one). We recommend making the HTO revocation effective the date of the order or the date of the last conviction.



# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau TRANSPORTATION

#### DRIVERS AND MOTOR VEHICLES

1997 Wisconsin Act 84 made extensive changes to this state's laws regarding operating a motor vehicle with an operating privilege that is suspended or revoked (OAR or OWS). Most of those changes are scheduled to take effect on May 1, 2000, or sooner if the department of transportation's (DOT's) computer system can accommodate the necessary changes.

This bill delays the effective date of those delayed changes until May 1, 2001, or until DOT's computer system can accommodate the necessary changes, whichever occurs earlier. The bill specifies that DOT is not required to implement all of the changes simultaneously, but may establish different effective dates for those changes. The bill makes an OAR or OWS committed in another jurisdiction a minor traffic offense for purposes of determining whether the offending driver is a habitual traffic offender. Under the bill, all OAR and OWS will be treated as minor traffic offenses, without regard to where the offense was committed.

Currently, DOT is required to revoke for a period of five years the operating privilege of a person determined to be a habitual traffic offender.
