ne State Patrol currently has statutory authority (ss.85.12) to administer a statewide public safety radio anagement program including statewide tower management, public safety frequency management, public safety tabase administration, and planning services related to statewide public safety radio management. Funding for ese tasks is partially provided under ss.20.395(5)(dk) which permits payments only from state agencies to nancially support the statewide public safety radio program. Receipt of revenues from non-state sources is not cluded in the existing authority.

ecause the enterprise system is not completely available to non-state agencies, those agencies who desire a similar stem, would be forced to administer their own programs, build or lease space on communications towers, provide eir own technical support, and develop their own interconnectability within individual agencies. All services ailable under the statewide Mobile Data Communications Network (MDCN) and Very High Frequency (VHF) inking would not be available to non-state agencies.

PROPOSED SOLUTION

The State Patrol needs additional statutory authority to enable it to provide statewide public safety radio system services to non-state agencies. Additional statutory authority would permit the State Patrol to 1) expend funds to provide managerial, support, technical, and maintenance services to non-state agencies, 2) levy fees to provide for hose services, and 3) collect fees pay for the services provided. This additional authority provides two major penefits: 1) the most effective administration of the statewide public safety radio program, and 2) the capability for the program to develop into an independent enterprise system in the near future.



John Etzler:

This draft creates a program revenue (PR type) appropriation for the statewide public safety radio program. Program revenue—service moneys must be credited to a program revenue—service (PR—S type) appropriation. See ss. 20.001 (2) (b) and (c) and 20.003 (3) (c) 2. and 3., stats.

I understand that s. 110.065, stats., directs all state patrol academy tuition payments including tuition payments received by DOT from other state agencies into a PR type appropriation. However, since academy tuition payments paid to DOT by other state agencies are PR-S moneys under law, s. 110.065, stats., is incorrectly drafted. Academy tuition payments received by DOT from other state agencies should be directed to a PR-S type appropriation. I cannot look to this incorrectly drafted example as a reason to knowingly draft something contrary to law. Specifically, I cannot renumber the appropriation account under s. 20.395 (5) (dk), stats., to be a PR type appropriation as you requested, if moneys paid to DOT by other state agencies will be credited to that appropriation.
