

-- could the new appropriation [20.370(3)(mw) - page 2, lines 1-5] be created as 20.370(3)(at) instead? Giving it the "at" alpha would keep it with the other enforcement and safety appropriations in the schedule.

-- under s. 29.591(3) [page 3, lines 1-10], DNR has asked that the language split the fee that is submitted to the department, so that 50% of the fee goes to the conservation fund (fish and wildlife account generally) and 50% of the fee goes to the new education and safety programs appropriation. Apparently the existing amount of hunter education course fees has to go to the fish and wildlife account to meet federal grant requirements, but they want any amounts above that (they're planning on doubling the fee) to gc into the new appropriation.



OTHER NATURAL RESOURCES

Under current law, the department of natural resources (DNR) administers various programs instructing persons in the safe use of snowmobiles, boats and all-terrain vehicles and in the safe use of firearms and bows for hunting. This bill makes changes to these instruction fees under these programs as follows:

1. For the snowmobile safety education program, under current law, the instruction fee is \$5, and the instructor keeps \$1 of the fee. This bill authorizes DNR to establish the fee by rule and to allow the instructor to keep up to 50% to cover his or her expenses.

2. For the all-terrain vehicle safety education program, current law authorizes DNR to charge an instruction fee. This bill requires that this fee be set by rule. It also authorizes an instructor to keep up to 50% of the fee collected to cover his or her costs.

3. For the boating safety education program, under current law, there is no limit established for the amount that an instructor may keep of the instruction fee to cover his or her expenses. The bill imposes a maximum of 50%.

4. Under the hunter education program, the instruction fee is set by statute at \$3. Under the bill, DNR sets the fee by rule. Also, under current law, an instructor who is authorized by DNR to conduct the hunter education program may keep

exactly 50% of the instruction fee to cover his or her expenses. Under the bill, the instructor may keep up to 50%.

Under the bill and under current law, the fees not kept by the instructors are remitted to DNR and are deposited in the conservation fund. Under the bill, all of the fees remitted to DNR under the snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle and boating safety education programs and 50% of the fees remitted under the hunter education program are credited to one appropriation to be used specifically for these safety programs. The other 50% of the fees remitted under the hunter education program are not appropriated for a specific purpose.

For further information see the **state** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fifty percent of all moneys remitted to the department of natural resources under s. 29.591 (3) and all moneys remitted to the department under ss. 23.33 (5) (d), 30.74 (1) (b) and 350.055 for programs or courses of instruction under ss. 23.33 (5) (d), 29.591, 30.74 (1) (a) and 350.055.

Notwithstanding section 227.24 (1) (a) and (3) of the statutes, the department is not required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under this subsection as an emergency rule is necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety or welfare and is not required to provide a finding of emergency for a rule promulgated under this subsection.
