Of the total, \$3 has been set aside to cover DNR administrative expenses, including the issuance fee, one warden enforcement position, and other administrative costs. The remaining \$10 (or 77% of \$13) is to be used for supplemental trail aids as specified in s.

Mary,

A few changes to LRB 0219/P1 relating to the supplemental trail aids from the nonresident snowmobile trail sticker revenues:

-- Is there a way to split the \$12.25 trail use sticker fee into \$10 for supplemental trail aids and \$2.25 for administrative and enforcement costs?

One suggestion is to modify page 2, lines 23-25 to state that \$10 of the fee under s. 350.12(3j)(b) shall be credited to the appropriation account under s. 20.370(5)(cw) and modify page 2, lines 2-5 to state that the appropriation is continuing and from the amounts credited to the appropriation under s. 350.12(4)(bg)2. Another section could be created to indicate that the \$2.25 would be used to the purposes under s. 350.12(4)(a). [I'm not sure if it is necessary to state where the remaining portion of the fee goes.]

Another suggestion is to modify s. 350.12(3j)(b) to split the \$12.25 and indicate that \$10 is for supplemental trail aids and \$2.25 is for administrative and enforcement costs. The other statutory changes could then just refer back to these provisions.

My intention is to eliminate the need for the 77% calculation by being able to refer to a specific amount/provision in s. 350.12. Separating the two components would also make future changes to the fee easier (most likely the Governor or Legislature would want to increase the trail aid portion and not the administrative/enforcement side) and not require future recalculation of which percentage of the new fee should go to what purpose.

I have discussed these changes with DNR and they did not see any problems with splitting the fee rather than using a percentage.

A few changes to LRB 0219/1:

- * Remove Section 1.
- * Remove Section 3.
- * Remove Section 4 or modify it (Page 3, line 2) to credit the amount to the snowmobile account of the conservation fund. Is this section necessary? Under s. 25.29(1m), the whole \$12.25 is deposited in the snowmobile account. Section 7 of the draft then determines to which appropriation \$10 of the \$12.25 is credited. The remaining amount should be available to cover any of the costs in ss.20.370(3)(aq), (5)(es), (9)(mu) and (mw); similar to how registration fees or the 1% of sales tax revenues collected are appropriated.

My intent is to not have to create another appropriation that expends money on the same things that four other appropriations already expend money on. I think leaving the remaining \$2.25 available for general appropriation provides the most flexibility to cover costs where and when needed. If a surplus builds up in the snowmobile account, these funds could be used for trail maintenance in the future.
