Current Language

s.20.435(5)(cm)

Proposed Change

Amend s.20.435 (5) (cm) as follows:

A sum sufficient not to exceed in fiscal year $\frac{1999-2000}{2000-2001}$ the difference between \$9,000,000 and the sum . . . and not to exceed in fiscal year $\frac{2000-2001}{2000-2001}$ the difference between \$9,000,000 and the sum . . . under s.252.04(1).

Effect of the Change

The appropriation language has been updated to account for the amount of federal funding anticipated in FY 00 and FY 01.

Rationale for the Change

The Department anticipates that it will receive approximately \$9 million in combined 317 and VFC funding for the immunization program in FY 99. It assumes that this level of funding will continue throughout the biennium.
