Title: SACWIS

Current Language

Section 46.45(2) describes the allocation of excess title IV-E funds received by the Department. Excess funds represent the amount of federal title IV-E child welfare funds claimed by the Department that are in excess of the amount of IV-E funds budgeted in support of the community aids basic county allocation under s. 46.40(2). Under s. 46.45(2), fifty percent of the excess funds are to be distributed to counties other than Milwaukee County for services to assist children and families.

Proposed Change

Require all counties to implement the Wisconsin Statewide Automated Child Welfare Information System (WISACWIS) by the end of FY 2005. Also, make the commitment to implement WISACWIS an eligibility requirement, beginning July 1, 2001, for counties to receive any of the excess IV-E funds currently available under s. 46.45(2). Authorize the Department to recoup any of the funds provided to any counties under s. 46.45(2) that do not meet their commitment to implement the system. 6/30 6/30/2006

Effect of the Change

Counties that have not implemented WISACWIS will not be eligible to receive any of the excess federal title IV-E funds claimed by the Department.

Rationale for the Change

The Department received state approval and funding to develop SACWIS. The system will be implemented first in Milwaukee. To be eligible for enhanced federal funding, however, the system must be statewide. The Department's Advanced Planning Document (APD), which was approved by the federal government, states that a statewide system is being developed. The automated system being designed for the Milwaukee child protective services program will be the base SACWIS system. If the federal government determines that the state is not making a good faith effort to implement the system statewide, the state is liable for returning the enhanced federal IV-E matching funds received for development of the system. Current estimates show \$2.7 million in enhanced funds received by the state and \$1.8 million in

enhanced funds received by the nine pilot counties. The \$4.5 million will have to be returned to the federal government, if Wisconsin does not have a statewide system. Also, federal funding for the ongoing operation of the system will be 50% if it is a statewide system, and only 27.5% if it is not.

Under current law, the state receives federal foster care and adoption assistance funding under Title IV-E of the federal social security act (generally referred to as "IV-E funds"), in reimbursement of moneys expended by the state and the counties for activities relating to foster care and the adoption of children. Currently, IV-E funds are credited to the community aids appropriation account of the department of health and family services (DHFS) and distributed to counties to provide social services for children and families. Currently, if on December 31 of any year there remains unspent or unencumbered in the community aids basic county allocation an amount that exceeds the amount of IV-E funds allocated as community aids in that year (excess IV-E funds), DHFS must carry forward to the next year those excess IV-E funds and distribute not less than 50% of those excess IV-E funds to counties having a population of less than 500,000 (counties) for services and projects to assist children and families.

This bill requires DHFS to establish and counties to implement a statewide automated child welfare information system (generally referred to as "WISACWIS") before July 1, 2006, permits DHFS, beginning on July 1, 2001, to distribute excess

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IV-E funds, ^{insert semicolon ✓} only to counties that are making a good faith effort to implement WISACWIS, and permits DHFS to recover from a county that does not implement WISACWIS before July 1, 2006, any excess IV-E funds distributed to that county after June 30, 2001.
