Title: Brighter Futures Initiative

Current Language

See attached chart "Proposed Brighter Futures Initiative - Programs & Current and Proposed Appropriations."

Proposed Change

The Department proposes to create a single funding source for programs targeted at the development of positive youth behaviors. The proposal would consolidate current categorical funding for eleven separate programs for youth in the areas of drug and alcohol abuse prevention, and adolescent services to develop self-sufficiency and prevent adolescent pregnancy. Current funding for these programs totals \$3,734,400.

The proposal is to repeal the current statutory provisions associated with each of the current categorical programs. The funding currently going to non-Milwaukee counties and organizations (\$1,534,300), the Tribes (\$180,000), and Milwaukee County (\$2,020,100) would be consolidated in a single new program called the Brighter Futures Initiative, and current levels of funding for non-Milwaukee counties, the Tribes, and Milwaukee County would be maintained for services in their respective areas. Non-Milwaukee counties could bid, on a competitive basis, for the newly consolidated funding. To be awarded three-year contract funding, counties would have to demonstrate that their planned use of the funds was consistent with the community plan developed under Family Preservation and Support. In Milwaukee County a planning committee will be formed to make recommendations to the Department on an allocation process. Grantees would be required to submit annual reports showing the status of key benchmark indicators and would have to demonstrate improvement on these indicators to get funding renewed. The effective date for the change would be July 1, 2000, for the calendar year 2001 funding cycle, to provide counties time to develop their plans. Funding consolidation for the Tribes would not be part of this initiative, since tribal funding is already included in a consolidated grant process.

A new statutory provision should be created in Chapter 46 directing the Department to provide funding to counties from the appropriation under (to be created) to assist families and communities to attain the competencies and social attributes necessary to become competent workers, parents and citizens. The initiative is intended to steer children and youth from the negative behaviors associated with many children and youth (crime and delinquency, school

failure, pregnancy, and substance abuse) The purpose of the grants should reflect the general purpose of the various categorical programs described in the attached chart (e.g., reduce neighborhood violence, reduce substance abuse, reduce adolescent pregnancies, and increase self-sufficiency). The Department should be directed to develop indicators to measure the outcomes expected from the program and to prepare a report to the Governor and Legislature by July 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, describing the outcome of the program. The indicators shall provide information relating to the prevalence of child abuse and neglect, unwed youth pregnancies, youth practicing abstinence to avoid unwed youth pregnancies and youth drug and alcohol use and abuse.

Effect of the Change

The effect of the proposal will be to enhance local prevention efforts by simplifying administration (one funding source and application) and providing more flexibility in the use of state funds for prevention programs by consolidating prevention funding, reducing program fragmentation, and increasing program effectiveness.

Rationale for the Change

Even though they are very similar in purpose, most of the eleven programs have their own statutory provisions. The programs have statutory directives on who is eligible to receive funding (counties, non-profit agencies, specific agencies) and there is a separate application for each program. With separate contracts and funding sources, and many different grantees, administration of these funds is more complex for both the contracting entities and the artment. In many cases the amounts provided each grantee are too small to be effective. The creation of numerous categorical programs has led to a fragmented approach to preventing risky youth behaviors, making it much more difficult to coordinate the programs at both the state and local level. This has resulted in minimal effectiveness and duplication of services. Little program evaluation is done and not enough is done to promote best practices and use prevention strategies proven to be the most effective.

The 1996 Legislative Audit Bureau report on prevention programs recommended that new initiatives be undertaken to foster coordination of prevention efforts at the local level. The audit report stated that opportunities to enhance local prevention efforts included developing more effective funding strategies that encourage the development of local prevention initiatives, providing more flexibility in the use of state funds for prevention programs, and providing more effective information and technical assistance services. The Department is proposing to consolidate prevention funding, thereby reducing program fragmentation and increasing program effectiveness







CHILDREN

Under current law, the department of health and family services (DHFS) provides grants for various programs relating to youth alcohol and other drug abuse, adolescent pregnancy and other adolescent services. Those programs include a neighborhood drug use and violence prevention program, a community alcohol and other drug abuse prevention program, a drug prevention program for Milwaukee public high school athletes, an adolescent self—sufficiency program, an adolescent pregnancy prevention program, an adolescent resource center in Milwaukee, a minority adolescent parenting skills program in Milwaukee and an adolescent choices project.

This bill eliminates all of those programs and instead creates a brighter futures initiative under which DHFS distributes grants to public or private organizations operating in Milwaukee County, county departments of human services, social services, community programs or developmental disabilities services operating in counties other than Milwaukee County, and federally recognized American Indian tribes or bands in this state, to provide programs to prevent and reduce the incidence of youth violence and other delinquent behavior, prevent and reduce the incidence of youth alcohol and other drug use and abuse, prevent and reduce the incidence of nonmarital pregnancy, increase the use of abstinence as a method of preventing

nonmarital pregnancy, prevent and reduce the incidence of child abuse and neglect and increase adolescent self-sufficiency by encouraging high school graduation, vocational preparedness, improved social and other interpersonal skills and responsible decision making. The bill requires DHFS to provide a set of benchmark indicators to measure the outcomes that are expected of a program funded under the initiative and permits DHFS to renew a grant only if the recipient shows improvement on those indicators.
