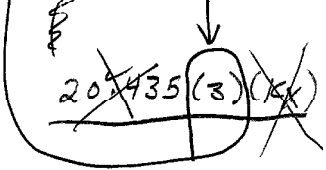

Under current law, moneys received from surcharges imposed on fines to persons convicted of violations of controlled substances laws are credited to an appropriation account for expenditure by the department of health and family services (DHFS) on programs of prevention, intervention and treatment for alcohol and other drug abuse problems. Of these moneys, \$250,000 are transferred in fiscal year 1997-98 to another appropriation account for expenditure for community aids, court intake services for children, shelter care, foster care and treatment foster care and mental health services. This bill eliminates this appropriation account transfer.

Currently, DHFS must distribute general purpose revenues of \$87,500 in fiscal year 1997-98 and \$175,000 in fiscal year 1998-99 to ARC Community Services, Inc., for a program to provide substance abuse day treatment services for pregnant and postpartum women and their infants. DHFS also distributes up to \$35,000 of federal block grant funds in each fiscal year as a grant to ARC Community Services, Inc., to address a projected operation deficit and to provide additional funding for staff and for transportation and meal expenses for chemically dependent women who receive services. This bill provides for the distribution of \$175,000 in each fiscal year to ARC



Community Services, Inc., for substance abuse day treatment services. The bill increases to \$235,000 in each fiscal year the distribution of federal block grant funds to provide funding for staff and for transportation and meal expenses of chemically dependent women clients.

Currently, DHFS must distribute \$100,000 in general purpose revenues as grants to programs that provide services to runaways. The bill decreases to \$50,000 the amount of general purpose revenue required to be distributed as grants for services to runaway children and specifies that the moneys will be provided in each fiscal year.

Currently, the department of workforce development (DWD) must transfer funds to DHFS for the purpose of licensing day care centers. This bill increases the amount that DWD must transfer.
