CIP 1A Reduction Rate

Current Language

s.49.45 (6b)(a) (b), (c)

Proposed Change

Amend s.49.45 (6b) (a), (b) and (c) to change the fiscal year and the relocation rate at the Centers for the Developmentally Disabled to a uniform \$184/day in FY 00 and \$190/day in FY 01.

Effect of the Change

The rates for relocation of residents at the Centers into the community will increase from the current \$184/day to \$190/day in FY 01.

Rationale for the Change

The Department proposes to increase the daily placement rate for residents relocated from the Centers into the community to \$190/day in FY01. The increase will be offset by setting the reduction rate at the same amount so that there will be no net increase in costs to the state.



Currently, under the community integration program (also known as the "CIP 1A program), after every relocation to the community of a resident of a state center for the developmentally disabled, the department of health and family services (DHFS) must reduce reimbursement to the center. The current reimbursement reduction rate is \$205 per day for relocations from the Central Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled and \$174 per day for relocations from the Northern Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled and the Southern Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled.

This bill changes to \$184 per day, beginning July 1, 1999, and to \$190 per day, beginning July 1, 2000, the amount by which DHFS must reduce reimbursement to all state centers for the developmentally disabled after each relocation of a state

center resident under the CIP 1A program.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 49.45 (6b) (intro.) of the statutes is renumbered 49.45 (6b) and amended to read:

CENTERS FOR THE DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED. From the 49.45 **(6b)** appropriation under s. 20.435 (2) (gk), the department may reimburse the cost of services provided by the centers for the developmentally disabled. Reimbursement to the centers for the developmentally disabled shall be reduced following each placement made under s. 46.275 which that involves a relocation from a center for the developmentally disabled, as follows: by \$184 per day, beginning in fiscal year 1999-00, and by \$190 per day, beginning in fiscal year 2000-01.


