DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

The Department is requesting revenues from the OWI (Operating While Intoxicated) surcharge to procure 493 Preliminary Breath Testing (PBT) instruments during the 1999-01 biennium. In order to receive those revenues, the Department is requesting the following appropriation change:

By July 31, 1999, or 30 days after the passage of the budget, the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS) will transfer \$290,900 from s. Chapter 20.435 (6) (hx) to the Department of Transportation, s. Chapter 20.395 (5) (ci), Breath screening instruments, state funds. Chapter 20.435 (6) (hx) is the DHFS appropriation for services related to drivers, where the state's portion of the OWI surcharge is deposited. In addition, s. Chapter 20.435 (6) (hx) would need to be amended to allow for the transfer of revenues to s. Chapter 20.395 (5) (ci).

JUSTIFICATION:

The PBTs are an extremely important tool in the enforcement of laws prohibiting the operation of motor vehicles while intoxicated. The arresting officer may evaluate several different indicators in order to determine whether a motorist may be intoxicated. These include driver behavior prior to the vehicle stop, the presence of the odor of alcohol, slurred speech, and the driver's performance of roadside sobriety tests. However, PBT testing offers several important advantages, including the following:

- The identification of motorists who are legally intoxicated, but not grossly impaired. This is particularly
 important in regard to "experienced drinkers" who are accustomed to the effects of alcohol, and are able to
 compensate to some extent.
- The identification of motorists who exhibit certain signs of intoxication due to a medical condition that is not related to the consumption of alcohol. For example, persons suffering from the effects of diabetes may be mistaken for intoxicated individuals.
- The PBTs are extremely useful in regard to the identification of motorists who are impaired due to illegal drug
 use. If a motorist appears to be intoxicated, and the PBT indicates that the motorist is not under the influence of
 alcohol, the arresting officer may decide to have the motorist tested for drugs.
- Use of the PBT prior to the arrest may benefit the prosecution in a contested case. Attorneys for the defense
 frequently argue that the case should be dismissed since the probable cause for the arrest was insufficient. The
 employment of the PBT prior to the arrest strengthens the prosecution argument that probable cause did exist.
- The use of revenues collected from the OWI surcharge is a logical source of funding for the replacement of the PBTs. Having those individuals convicted of OWI pay for the PBT replacement necessary to enforce Wisconsin's drunk driving laws is consistent with the decision to procure 325 new evidential breath testing instruments with OWI funds as part of the 1997-99 biennial budget.

We have reviewed the language in the above noted draft and agree that it meets the needs of the agency for inclusion in the budget.

However, we do have two concerns relating to language in the existing appropriation:

- 1.) Under the statutory language for appropriation 20.395 (5) (ci), is the language "...for the purchase and maintenance of breath screening instruments." broad enough to include preliminary breath testing instruments. Does the language need to be changed to reflect that we are purchasing PBTs? (i.e. "...including preliminary breath testing instruments.").
- 2.) Under the statutory language for appropriation 20.395 (5) (ci), "...the unencumbered balance in this appropriation account on June 30 of each year shall be transferred to the appropriation account under s. 20.435 (6) (hx)." Because of the complex nature of these types of procurements and the timing of the passage of the budget during 1999 (the 1997-99 budget was enacted on October 11, 1997) this provision may create difficulties with encumbering the dollars available before the end of the fiscal year. Would it be possible to look at the removal of this provision from the statuory language for this appropriation?
