TOPIC: Funding for Statewide Public Safety Radio Program-DOT

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

Under current law, the Division of State Patrol, Bureau of Communications has statutory authority to provide frequency management, database administration and tower site coordination for statewide public safety radio communications through a PR-Service appropriation. Funding for that appropriation is provided on a 50/50 basis by the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Transportation. This appropriation change provides for the Department of Transportation transfer of those revenues.

JUSTIFICATION:

This appropriation change continues the current funding arrangement for the 1999-01 biennium during the transition to an enterprise system (the concept of the enterprise system is a coordinated, multi-agency cooperative approach for the provision of public safety radio communications in this state).

The appropriation change should read as follows:

By July 31, 1999, or 30 days after the passage of the budget, the Department of Transportation will transfer \$68,700 from s. Chapter 20.3 (5) (dq), Vehicle inspection, traffic enforcement & radio management - State Funds, to the Department of Transportation, Division of State Patrol, s. Chapter 20.395 (5) (dk), Public safety radio management, service funds.

By July 31, 2000, the Department of Transportation will transfer \$68,700 from s. Chapter 20.3 (5) (dq), Vehicle inspection, traffic enforcement & radio management - State Funds, to the Department of Transportation, Division of State Patrol, s. Chapter 20.395 (5) (dk), Public safety radio management, service funds.

By July 31, 1999, or 30 days after the passage of the budget, the Department of Transportation will transfer \$32,400 from s. Chapter 20.3 (3) (cq), State highway rehabilitation - state funds, to the Department of Transportation, Division of State Patrol, s. Chapter 20.395 (5) (dk), Public safety radio management, service funds.
