(4) Subscriber lists. Notwithstanding s. 19.35, the department may refuse to reveal names and addresses of persons on any publication subscriber list. The department may charge a fee to recover the actual costs for providing or for the use of a publication subscriber list. No person who obtains or uses a publication subscriber list from the department may refer to the department or the publication as the source of names or addresses unless the person clearly indicates that the provision of or permission to use the subscriber list in no way indicates the department's knowledge, involvement, approval, authorization or connection with the person or the person's activities.

23.27(3)(b)

(b) Access to information; fees. The department shall make information and data from the natural heritage inventory program available to any individual or public or private agency for research, educational, environmental, land management or similar authorized purposes. The department may establish a fee to be collected to recover the actual cost of collecting, storing, managing, compiling and providing this information and data. The department may reduce or waive the fee established under this paragraph if the department determines that a waiver or reduction of the fee is in the public interest. The natural heritage inventory and related information and data are not subject to s. 19.35 and the department may refuse to release information or data for any purpose which is not authorized.

Request:

The Department is requesting the following statutory language that parallels language contained in s. 23.165(4), Stats. and s. 23.27 (3) (b), Stats., as it relates to the disclosure of public record customer lists in the custody of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Both sections exempt the information from s. 19.35, Stats., which normally requires disclosure of public records, and both sections also allow the DNR to charge the actual cost of developing the information. A similar approach for Tourism reads as follows:

41.11 (4) CUSTOMER LISTS. Notwithstanding s. 19.35, the department may refuse to reveal names, addresses and related demographic information maintained in any list it has developed of persons who have asked the department about travel opportunities in the state. Notwithstanding s. 19.71, the department may establish a fee to be charged to recover the actual costs of compiling and providing any such customer list of names, addresses and related demographic information. The department may reduce or waive the fee established under this paragraph if the department determines that a waiver or reduction of the fee is in the public interest.
