Indirect Cost Appropriation

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

The department requests creation of an indirect cost appropriation for the purposes authorized in s. 16.54(9)(b) Wisconsin Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) amends section 302, United States Code, to authorize a qualified transportation department to be reimbursed for allowable administrative costs associated with FHWA's transportation programs. The department requests creation of an indirect cost appropriation for the purposes authorized under state statute.

Federal reimbursements of indirect costs are authorized under the statutes and have been utilized by a number of state agencies for administrative purposes, program purposes, funding of positions, payment of federal aid disallowances, or other purposes authorized by law. The UW-System, Departments of Natural Resources, Health and Family Services, and Public Instruction, as well a number of other agencies, have already established indirect cost reimbursement programs.

OMB Circular A-87, "Cost Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Governments" establishes principles and standards for determining costs for federal awards. Section 16.543(9), stats., defines indirect cost reimbursement and identifies appropriate uses of these federal dollars. Uses include "administrative purposes, program purposes, funding of positions, payment of federal aid disallowances, or other purposes authorized by law." The statutes prescribe that indirect cost reimbursements be deposited in an account (appropriation) established to receive these reimbursements.

Because of the change included in TEA-21, the Department now has the option of claiming federal reimbursement for the share of administrative costs that benefit federal programs. The indirect cost reimbursement appropriation should be established in the biennial budget, with no initial spending authority included in the Chapter 20 schedule. Upon completion of the plan and approval by the federal government, the department will request spending authority consistent with the level of reimbursements generated by the approved indirect cost rate.
