 - b) Eliminate s.49.32 obsolete.
 - c) s.49.32(7)(b)(c) and (d) replace AFDC with W-2.
 - d) Repeal 49.37.
 - e) Update years for s.49.24, 49.155(1g)(b), 49.155(1g(c) I will send updated \$ amounts as soon as possible.

The W-2 agency pays the participant a monthly grant of \$673 minus \$5.15 for each hour of required work or education or be training that the participant misses without good cause. If the W-2 agency requires fewer than 30 hours of work per week because the participant has part-time unsubsidized employment, the grant amount may also reduced by an amount equal to the product of \$5.15 and the difference between 30 and the number of hours the participant is required to work. participant is required to work.
