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LICENSE CANCELLATION FOR NONPAYMENT OF DEBIT OR G. CREDIT CARD

Summary and Justification

A current statute requires the department to cancel a license that is issued on the basis of payment by a check that is not paid by the bank upon which it is drawn. This statute does not cover credit card payments and should be amended to anticipate this need. . fin. rasht.

Proposed Statutory Language

440.23 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

(1) If the holder of a credential pays a fee required under s. 440.05 (1) or (6), 440.08, 444.03, 444.05, 444.1/1 or 459.46 (2) (b) by check, debit card or credit card and the check is not paid by the bank upon which the check is drawn, or if a demand for payment under a debit or credit card transaction is not paid by the bank upon which demand is made, the department may cancel the credential on or after the 60th day after the department receives the notice from the bank, subject to sub. (2).

Initial applicability of this proposal: effective date of budget act.

REPEAL OF OUTDATED STATUTE PERMITTING PAYMENT BY CREDIT CARD

Summary and Justification

A statute relating specifically to the department, sec. 440.23, permits the department to accept payment by credit card, but does not recognize the use of a debit card. However, payment by credit and debit cards is authorized under a general statute governing payments to the state, sec. 20.905, Stats.

The specific statute authorizing the department to accept credit payments should be amended to remove any ambiguity created by the two existing overlapping statutes and to make it clear that the department may utilize the broader authority granted in the general payments statute.

Proposed Statutory Language

440.055 (1) of the statutes is repealed

440.055 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

440.055 (2) If the department permits the payment of a fee with use of a credit card under sub. (1), the department shall charge a credit card service charge for each transaction. The credit card service charge shall be in addition to the fee that is being paid with the credit card and shall be sufficient to pay the costs to the department for providing this service to persons who request it, including the cost of any services for which the department contracts under sub. (3).

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of regulation and licensing (DORL) may, under certain circumstances, cancel a credential if the credential holder pays an initial or renewal credential fee with a check that is not paid by the bank upon which the check is drawn. This bill allows DORL to cancel a credential under the same circumstances if the credential holder pays an initial or renewal credential fee with either: 1) a check that is not paid by the financial institution upon which the check is drawn; or 2) a credit or debit card and the demand for payment under the debit or credit card transaction is not paid by the financial institution upon which demand is made.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 440.23 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

440.23 (1) If the holder of a credential pays a fee required under 440.05 (1)

or (6), 440.08, 444.03, 444.05, 444.11 or 459.46 (2) (b) by check or debit or credit card

and the check is not paid by the bank financial institution upon which the check is drawn or if the demand for payment under the debit or credit card transaction is not paid by the financial institution upon which demand is made, the department may cancel the credential on or after the 60th day after the department receives the notice from the bank financial institution, subject to sub. (2).

SECTION 2. 440.23 (2) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

440.23 (2) (intro.) At least 20 days before canceling a credential, the department shall mail a notice to the holder of the credential that informs the holder that the check or demand for payment under the debit or credit card transaction was not paid by the bank financial institution and that the holder's credential may be canceled on the date determined under sub. (1) unless the holder does all of the following before that date:

SECTION 3. 440.23 (2) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

440.23 (2) (a) Pays the fee for which the unpaid check <u>or demand for payment</u> under the credit or <u>debit card transaction</u> was issued.

The preneed seller files with the department a bond furnished by a surety company authorized to do business in this state or an irrevocable letter of credit from a financial institution, as defined in s. 157.19 (1), and the amount of the bond or letter of credit is sufficient to secure the cost to the cemetery authority of constructing the mausoleum.

Please review this bill very carefully to make sure that it achieves your intent. Note that the bill makes changes that are in addition to the changes suggested in the instructions in order to consistently refer to "financial institutions", rather than to banks. Also, the bill does not amend s. 440.23 (2) (c), stats., which requires a person to pay an overdraft charge established by the depository selection board, because I was not sure how to treat this provision in the context of credit or debit card transactions. Is this provision okay, or should it be treated in some manner?
