G. LICENSE CANCELLATION FOR NONPAYMENT OF DEBIT OR CREDIT CARD

Summary and Justification

A current statute requires the department to cancel a license that is issued on the basis of payment by a check that is not paid by the bank upon which it is drawn. This statute does not cover credit card payments and should be amended to anticipate this need.

Proposed Statutory Language

440.23 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

(1) If the holder of a credential pays a fee required under s. 440.05 (1) or (6), 440.08, 444.03, 444.05, 444.11 or 459.46 (2) (b) by check, debit card or credit card and the check is not paid by the bank upon which the check is drawn, or if a demand for payment under a debit or credit card transaction is not paid by the bank upon which demand is made, the department may cancel the credential on or after the 60th day after the department receives the notice from the bank, subject to sub. (2).

Initial applicability of this proposal: effective date of budget act.

H. REPEAL OF OUTDATED STATUTE PERMITTING PAYMENT BY CREDIT CARD

Summary and Justification

A statute relating specifically to the department, sec. 440.23, permits the department to accept payment by credit card, but does not recognize the use of a debit card. However, payment by credit and debit cards is authorized under a general statute governing payments to the state, sec. 20.905, Stats.

The specific statute authorizing the department to accept credit payments should be amended to remove any ambiguity created by the two existing overlapping statutes and to make it clear that the department may utilize the broader authority granted in the general payments statute.

Proposed Statutory Language

440.055 (1) of the statutes is repealed

440.055 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

440.055 (2) If the department permits the payment of a fee with use of a credit card under sub. (1), the department shall charge a credit card service charge for each transaction. The credit card service charge shall be in addition to the fee that is being paid with the credit card and shall be sufficient to pay the costs to the department for providing this service to persons who request it, including the cost of any services for which the department contracts under sub. (3).

Initial applicability of this proposal: effective date of budget act.

I. REVISE TEMPORARY PERMITS FOR PRIVATE SECURITY PERSONS Summary and Justification

Current statutes restrict the issuance of a temporary private security permit to situations where the department is not able to grant or deny an application because a background check of the individual is not complete. The permit is effective for a maximum of 30 days. These restrictions on the permit limit its usefulness. The requirements are changed to provide for a 90-day temporary permit upon completion of an application, payment of a temporary fee and the cost of a criminal records check. Inability to complete a criminal records check is removed as a condition for issuing the permit.

Proposed Statutory Language

440.26 (5r) (a) 1., 2., and (c) 1. of the statutes are amended to read:

- 1. The individual has completed an application and provided information required under sub. (5m) (a) and paid the fees required under secs. 440.03 (13) and 440.05 (6).
- 2. The department is not yet able does not have information sufficient to determine whether to grant or deny the individual's application because a background check of the individual is not complete.
- (c) 1. Except as provided in subd. 2., a temporary private security permit issued under par. (a) is valid for 30 90 days.
- 2. A temporary private security permit issued under par. (a) shall expire on the date that the individual receives written notice from the department that a background check of the individual has been completed and that the department is granting or denying the individual's application for a private security permit, if that date occurs before the end of the period specified in subd. 1.
- 3. A temporary private security permit issued under par. (a) may not be renewed.

Initial applicability of this proposal: effective date of budget act.

J. REVISE RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE DETECTIVES AND PRIVATE SECURITY PERSONNEL

Summary and Justification

Existing requirements mandate that private detectives and private security personnel who apply to renew must be employed by a private detective agency. This requirement is antiquated and unnecessarily restrictive on the movement of detectives and security personnel from one agency to another.
