PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) is directed to allocate certain moneys for various public assistance programs. This bill eliminates the requirement that moneys be allocated for some of the programs and adds new programs to the list of those for which moneys must be allocated.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) is directed to allocate certain moneys for various public assistance programs. This bill eliminates the requirement that moneys be allocated for some of the programs and adds new programs to the list of those for which moneys must be allocated, including all of the following:

1. A program to fund efforts to provide an emotionally and intellectually stimulating environment for certain low-income children under the age of four.
2. A literacy program targeted at certain low-income individuals.
3. A competitive grant program to fund programs that improve social, academic and employment skills of certain low-income youth.
4. A program to assist low-income workers maintain their jobs and improve their basic skills.
5. A program to match retirees with youth to provide the youth with workforce mentoring.
6. A program to encourage the positive involvement of fathers in their children's lives.
7. A grant program under which DWD is authorized to award up to \$1,000,000 to counties and private entities to provide community-based alcohol and other drug

abuse treatment that is targeted at certain low-income individuals. DWD must coordinate the program with any similar program that the department of health and family services (DHFS) administers.

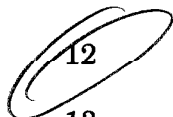
