Currently, the department of veterans affairs reimburses eligible veterans for 50% (100% if a disabled veteran) of the tuition and fees incurred by the veteran while attending a postwise condary school as an undergraduate. This bill raises the reimbursement rate to 65% of the tuition and fees incurred by a non-disabled veteran.

Under current law, reimbursement is only available for classes in an institution in the University of Wisconsin system, at a technical college or for classes attended by a veteran receiving a waiver of nonresident tuition. Reimbursement is limited to tuition and fees paid for 120 part—time or full—time credits or 8 full semesters at an institution in the University of Wisconsin system, or for 60 part—time or full—time credits or 4 full semesters at a technical college, or an equivalent amount of credits at the institution at which the veteran is receiving a waiver of tuition. This bill allows the veteran to attend any institution of higher education, including technical colleges, but requires the veteran to enroll for alleast 12 credits during the semester for which reimbursement is requested.

Under current law, an eligible veteran who completes a correspondence course or a course as a part—time student from an institution of higher education may apply for reimbursement for part of the costs of the course. The veteran must be a resident of this state and generally only undergraduate courses are eligible for reimbursement under current law. Currently, the course must be related to the veteran's occupational, professional or employment objectives. Under current law, the maximum reimbursement that may be paid is 50% of the tuition and fees paid for the course but not more that 50% of the standard cost for a state resident for tuition and fees for an equivalent undergraduate course at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

This bill increases the maximum reimbursement percentage from 50% to 65%. The bill also provides that, if the department of veterans affairs DVAK requests permission from the joint committee on finance to supplement the appropriation account for the correspondence and part-time strangeourse and the committee does not schedule a meeting to review the request, the requested supplement to that appropriation is approved.

The cite for Public Law 89–329 is 20 USC 403, but that statute is now omitted from the code because the funding for that program no longer exists.
