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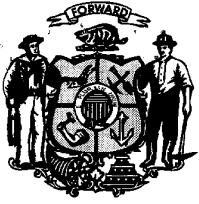

Please draft as a new DOA draft, language that amends 20.680 (2) (J) Circuit court automation systems to read: four-ninths of the money received under s. 814.635 (1). 814.635 of the statutes needs to be amended to read: the clerk of circuit court shall charge and collect a \$9 justice information fee from any person. 20.505 (1) (ja) of the statutes needs to be amended to read: four-ninths of the moneys received under s. 814.635 (1) shall be credited to this appropriation account.

The intent of this request is to raise the justice information fee from seven dollars to nine dollars, of this \$9, \$4 should go to appropriation 20.680 (2) (j), \$4 to appropriation 20.505 (1) (ja) and the remaining \$1 to the general fund.

Under current law, when the clerk of circuit court collects a fee from a person commencing a civil action, including garnishment, small claims and forfeiture actions, the clerk is also required to collect a \$7 justice information system fee. Four-sevenths of the \$7 fee is used to pay the costs incurred by the department of administration (DOA) to develop and operate the automated justice information system, which is used by the director of state courts, circuit courts, public defender, departments of corrections and justice and by district attorneys. Two-sevenths of the \$7 fee is used to pay the costs incurred by the director of state courts for the operation of the circuit court automated system, the court of appeals automated information system, the supreme court automated information system and for the payment of interpreter fees. The remaining \$1 of the fee goes into the general fund without any designated purpose.
