Hazardous Materials Registration Program

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

The Department of Transportation requests the appropriation created to support the costs of implementing the Hazardous Materials Registration Program in the Division of Motor Vehicles be repealed. In addition, any remaining balance should be deposited into the Transportation Fund.

Repeal the appropriation designated under s.20.395(4)(bh) and s.166.20(7g) associated with the hazardous materials registration program. Create a non-statutory provision requiring any remaining balance should be deposited into the Transportation Fund.

JUSTIFICATION:

1997 Wisconsin Act 27 eliminated the Hazardous Materials Registration Fee. Now that the program has been closed out, the department's appropriation which supports the costs of administering the registration fee program is no longer necessary. A repeal of this appropriation is requested. In addition, any remaining balance should be deposited into the Transportation Fund. Any remaining balance will be used to offset costs associated with administering and closing out the program, as well as those costs associated with refunding fees under court order in the disposition of the American Trucking Association lawsuit.

Under current law, the division of emergency management in the department of military affairs establishes hazardous materials transportation registration fees. The fees are collected by the department of transportation (DOT) from persons who, because they transport hazardous materials, are required to file federal hazardous materials transportation registration statements. The collected fees are deposited in the general fund and used in part by DOT to administer the fee. This bill eliminates the hazardous materials transportation registration fee, and lapses the unencumbered balance of fees appropriated to DOT to administer the fees from the general fund to the transportation fund.

The draft looks fine. However, DOT has some concerns with the analysis because it may lead legislators to believe this is a fee that is currently being collected. The following language is simply a suggestion:

DOT has not collected the Hazardous Materials Registration Fee since a successful court challenge of the fee by the American Trucking Association in 1996. All Hazardous Materials Registration Fees have since been refunded to the registrants. In the 1997-99 biennial budget, the legislature changed the funding source for the Department of Military Affairs and Hazardous Materials Response Team Grant Program from the Transportation Fund to GPR funds. This eliminated the need for collecting the Hazardous Materials Registration Fee, which had served to partially reimburse the Transportation Fund for expenditures on the Hazardous Materials Response Team Grant Program. However, the language requiring the Hazardous Materials Registration Fee collection and promulgation of rules pertaining to fee collection was not removed.
