Take a look at the LRB draft (#0757) containing the ch. 20 language which will control the flow of the Indian gaming compact revenue.

My LRB drafter (Rick Champagne) has changed the ch. 569 language slightly and created a new appropriation to receive the compact money -- **20.505(8)(hm)**. Previously I indicated that the appropriation account from which the revenue would be drawn was to be (8)(h), however this has now changed. Take a look at the new language. Note that each of your items must be listed in my draft under 20.505(8)(hm) as one of the subs that start on page 3, line 7.

Drafting Instructions:

- It is important that your drafters know that this is part of the **Indian Gaming Initiative** so that LRB has a way of coordinating all of these drafts. If you or your drafter have technical questions regarding the drafting, you can ask me or talk to Rick Champagne (6-9930).
- Note that my draft addresses the prorating issue I mentioned to you the week before last. You do not need to have your drafter address this -- it will be taken care of in my draft. (As I mentioned, the chance for proration is very slim.) Revenues will be transferred to the receiving appropriation accounts on November 15th of each year. An exception will be included for appropriations that fund positions; they will receive the revenue at the beginning of the fiscal year.
- The appropriations receiving the Indian gaming revenue should be drafted as PR-S. Note that existing appropriations that are GPR, PRO or FED will have to be re-created/re-numbered as PR-S (or a additional, separate appropriation will be needed if Indian gaming funding is to supplement existing funding).
- My drafter recommends that appropriations receiving Indian gaming money be drafted as follows:

The amounts in the schedule for (your program) under s. (your statutes). All moneys transferred from the appropriation under s.20.505(8)(hm)(sub xxx) shall be credited to this appropriation account. [The sub xxx will refer to your program's reference under (8)(hm) --see page 3, line 7 of the draft.]

My drafter indicates that, except in special circumstances, your drafts won't need to have
effective date provisions. The language in my draft that refers to transferring the amounts
in the schedule should take care of programs that start Indian gaming funding in the
second year of the biennium. The excel table I e-mailed you several weeks ago shows the
