Please draft as a new DOA draft, language that amends 938.533(1) Corrective Sanctions. (2) Corrective Sanctions Program to read: The department shall place a program participant in the community, provide intensive surveillance of the participant and provide an average of \$3,000 per slot to purchase community-based treatment services for each participant.

The intent of this request is to lower the statutory amount that has to be spent per slot from \$5,000 to \$3,000. The reason for this request is because of lower spending by the Department of Corrections to purchase services.

This bill reduces the amount that DOC must provide to purchase community-based treatment services for each corrective sanctions program participant to \$3,000 per year per slot.
