The following statutory language requests submitted by the University of Wisconsin System should be drafted for inclusion in the biennial budget bill.

1). Amend s.36.27 (4) (a) by extending the sunset date for the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) until June 30, 2001. Priority: high

2). Eliminate the following GPR annual appropriations: 20.285 (1) (eo), 20.285 (1) (fs) and 20.285 (1) (fx). The funding would be folded in the University's general program operations appropriation 20,285 (1) (a). Priority: high

3). Exempt UW faculty and academic staff from the salary cap in s. 16.417. Require exempted individuals, those whose total outside salary exceeds \$12,000, to report to their chancellor on the interagency employment activities which generated the additional salary including the identity of the agency, the salary received, and services performed.

Priority: high

4) Repeal the appropriation under s. 20.285 (1) (gm). Priority: high

5). Amend s. 20.924 to exempt University cash-funded projects from enumeration. The University proposed the following language. "This section does not apply to projects for the University of Wisconsin System funded entirely from federal or private gifts, grants or other cash sources." Priority: high


