Rate Setting

Current Language

s.51.42(3)(as) 3. specifies the rate setting process for the Mental Health Institutes (MHIs).

Proposed Change

Amend s.51.42(3)(as) 3. to allow for more flexibility in setting rates at the MHIs.

Effect of the Change

Changing the way that rates are set will allow the MHIs more flexibility in pricing their services in an economically competitive manner.

Rationale for the Change

The Department annually sets rates at the MHIs. The Department is authorized to establish rates that are based on the per diem cost of specific levels of care. There is no flexibility in the rate setting process and the MHIs are unable to set rates that might make them economically more competitive. When the Department's Long Term Care initiative is established, the Institutes will need to be able to set rates that respond to client and provider needs in a more flexible manner. For example, the Institutes may find that it is a good financial practice to sell advance bed days at a discount to counties. Allowing the MHIs flexibility in their rate setting will also help the Institutes to adapt to long term care reform as it continues to evolve.



MENTAL ILLNESS AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Under current law, county departments of community programs authorize all care of any patient in mental health institutes, which are operated by the department of health and family services (DHFS). If a mental health institute provides a county department of community programs with service, DHFS regularly bills the county department for the care at rates that reflect the estimated per diem cost of specific levels of care, as adjusted periodically by DHFS.

This bill authorizes DHFS to set rates on a flexible basis, rather than at the estimated per diem cost of specific levels of care, for billing county departments of community programs for care provided in mental health institutes. The bill requires that the flexible rate structure set by DHFS recover the cost of operations.

For further information see the **state and local** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 51.42 (3) (as) 3. of the statutes is amended to read:

51.42 (3) (as) 3. Care, services and supplies provided after December 31, 1973, to any person who, on December 31, 1973, was in or under the supervision of a mental health institute, or was receiving mental health services in a facility authorized by s. 51.08 or 51.09, but was not admitted to a mental health institute by the department of health and family services, shall be charged to the county department of community programs which was responsible for such care and services at the place where the patient resided when admitted to the institution. The department of health and family services shall may bill county departments of community programs for care provided at the mental health institutes at rates which reflects the estimated per diem cost of specific levels of care, to be adjusted periodically by the department of health and family services sets on a flexible basis, except that this flexible rate structure shall cover the cost of operations of the mental health institute⁵.
