The intent of this request is to create minimum requirements for land and water resource management plans prepared under s. 92.10.

This proposal would modify s. 92.10 as indicated below.

s. 92.10 – require land conservation committees to prepare land and water resource management plans that, at a minimum, include the following:

A countywide assessment of water quality and soil erosion conditions;

• Identification of water quality and soil erosion control goals and those areas which may not be meeting those goals;

Identification of applicable nonpoint source and soil erosion performance standards and prohibitions, subject to the provisions of chapters 92, 281, 283 and sections 59.692 and 59.693;

 A multiyear description of planned county land and water resource related activities and priorities, including those aimed to meet the identified goals and ensure compliance with the identified standards and prohibitions;

- A system to track the progress of activities identified in the plan;
- An information and education strategy; and
- Methods for coordinating plan implementation activities with programs offered by other applicable local, state and federal agencies and organizations.

Becky,

Please make the following modifications to LRB 1243/1:

Modify ss. 92.04(2)(b) and 92.10(5)(a) to require the board to review and approve or disapprove the land and water resource management plans prepared under s. 92.10. The board would no longer make recommendations to the department on approval or disapproval of the plans.

Modify s. 92.10(4)(d) to require the department to review, in conjunction with the Department of Natural Resources, land and water resource management plans, summarize the plans and make recommendations to the Land and Water Conservation Board on approval or disapproval of the plans. Retain the second sentence of s. 92.10(4)(d).

The intent of these changes is to create a joint DATCP/DNR review process for the land an water resource management plans (as a first step to integrating the nonpoint and soil and water conservation activities) and to give the LWCB the authority to approve or disapprove the plans.
