Please draft a statutory language change proposed by the Department of Veterans Affairs as part of their statutory language budget request. The department requests a change in s.45.35 (5)(2.1(c)) which would modify the residency requirement so that members of the armed services that serve on duty for five consecutive years in the state of Wisconsin would satisfy the residency requirements under this statute. If a veteran is serving in Wisconsin immediately prior to discharge, any consecutive time served prior to discharge will be credited toward satisfying the 5-consecutive year requirement. The request is included in the original package of statutory language for Veterans Affairs.

You requested draft statutory language that would enable an individual to establish state residency after entry into service. The following statutory amendment will accomplish this goal. It should be inserted in lieu of the current proposal submitted to DOA.

SECTION 1. 45.25(2)(d) of the statutes is amended to read:

45.25(2)(d) The individual is a resident at the time of application for the tuition and fee reimbursement program and was a Wisconsin resident at the time of entry or reentry into service or was a resident for any consecutive 5-year period after completing entry or reentry into service on active duty and before the time of application. If a person applying for a benefit under this section meets the 5-consecutive-year residency requirement, the department may not require the person to reestablish that he or she meets the 5-consecutive-year residency requirement when he or she later applies for any other benefit under this chapter that requires a 5-consecutive-year residency.

SECTION 2. 45.35(5)(a)2.c. of the statutes is amended to read:

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45.35(5)(a)2.c. 
