Subject: Legal fees charged by the Department of Justice (DOJ)

Attached are revisions to ss. 165.25(6)(a) and 20.455(1)(km).

DOJ is directed by s. 165.25(6)(a) to provide legal services to state agencies when requested to do so by agency heads. My goal is to clarify which appropriation is credited when DOJ provides legal services to state agencies. Three scenarios exist:

- 1) DOJ enters into an agreement to provide ongoing services to state agencies. Such agreements, contracts, or understandings and relevant spending authority must be approved under ss. 16.505 and 16.515 or the budget process. These funds must be credited to s. 20.455(1)(km) Interagency and intra-agency assistance as program revenue.
- 2) When such arrangements do not exist or have not been approved, funds collected for providing legal services to agencies enumerated in s. 165.25 must be deposited to the general fund per ss. 165.25(4)(d) and 20.001(4) General purpose revenue earned.
- 3) Agencies not enumerated in s. 165.25 and who do not have an agreement authorized under ss. 16.505 and 16.515 may not be charged for legal services.

I believe these revisions will provide clarity. Take a look and let me know if you have any questions. Thanks.

#### 165.25(6)(a)

At the request of the head of any department of state government, the attorney general may appear for and defend any state department, or any state officer, employe or agent of the department in any civil action or other matter brought before a court or an administrative agency which is brought against the state department, or officer, employe or agent for or on account of any act growing out of or committed in the lawful course of an officer's, employe's or agent's duties. Witness fees or other expenses determined by the attorney general to be reasonable and necessary to the defense in the action or proceeding shall be paid as provided for in s. 885.07. The attorney general may compromise and settle the action as the attorney general determines to be in the best interest of the state. Members, officers and employes of the Wisconsin state agencies building corporation and the Wisconsin state public building corporation are covered by this section. Members of the board of governors created under s. 619.04 (3), members of a committee or subcommittee of that board of governors, members of the patients compensation fund peer review council created under s. 655.275 (2) and persons consulting with that council under s. 655.275 (5) (b) are covered by this section with respect to actions, claims or other matters arising before, on or after April 25, 1990. The attorney general may compromise and settle claims asserted before such actions or matters formally are brought or may delegate such authority to the department of administration. This paragraph may not be construed as a consent to sue the state or any department thereof or as a waiver of state sovereign immunity. Any funds collected under this provision based on understandings or contracts between the department of justice and other state agencies approved under ss. 16.505 and 16.515 or the budget process shall be credited to s. 20.455(1)(km). If such spending authority has not been approved, funds obtained under this provision by the department of justice for providing legal services to state agencies shall be handled under s. 165.25(4)(d) and s. 20.001(4). Agencies not enumerated in s. 165.25 and who do not have contracts or agreements with DOJ authorized under ss. 16.505 or 16.515 shall not be charged for legal services.

#### 20.455(1)(km)

Interagency and intra-agency assistance. The amounts in the schedule to provide legal services to state agencies. All moneys received from the department or any other state agency for legal services shall be credited to this appropriation. Amounts in this appropriation reflect contracts and arrangements for payment between the department of justice and state agencies that have been approved pursuant to ss. 16.505 and 16.515 procedures or the budget process.
