Steve,

Please produce a draft to achieve the following goals:

I want a rate increase for medical assistance (MA) dental service providers.

For dental services provided in an MA fee-for-service context, provide a 10%

rate increase in FY00 and a 10% rate increase in FY01.

If this 10% increase costs more than \$1,240,200 GPR in FY00, then the actual rate increase is what this \$1,240,200 GPR will buy.

If the FY01 10% increase costs more than \$2,740,800 GPR, then the actual rate increase is what this \$2,740,800 GPR will buy.

The actual rate increase in FY01 also will be limited by the percentage increase (in FY00 as compared to FY99) in the number of MA eligibles (not enrolled in HMOs with dental coverage) who receive dental care. In no case can the percentage increase exceed 10% or the cost of any rate increase in FY01 exceed the \$2,740,800 GPR amount (whichever costs less GPR).

Some examples:

If the percentage increase in MA eligibles is 5%, then the rate increase would be 5%.

If the percentage increase in MA eligibles is 15%, then the rate increase would be 10% (and if, e.g., upon recalculation with more recent data, the cost of that 10% increase is \$3,000,000 GPR, the rate increase would be the increase made possible by only \$2,740,800 GPR).

DHFS will have the responsibility for determining the actual increase in MA eligibles receiving dental services and will do this by 8/1/2000.


