FY 1999-2001 Budget Statutory Language Proposal

The following is an additional statutory language proposal for the FY1999-2001 biennial budget. I have indicated my priority ranking below.

The intent of this request is to create grants to provide assistance to local units of government and regional planning commissions for planning. The funding for the would be provided from federal TEA 21 (transportation enhancement act) moneys. Grants would be awarded by the Department of Administration (DOA) after both DOA and the Department of Transportation (DOT)approve the proposed plan for disbursement of the funds.

- Create a new PR-S appropriation in s. 20.505(1) to receive moneys transferred from DOT to fund grants for planning activities undertaken by local units of government and regional planning commissions.
- Modify the appropriation under s. 20.395(3)(ix) to allow the transfer of \$1 million annually to the new planning grants PR-S appropriation under DOA.
- In ch. 16 of the statutes provide the department the authority to award planning grants to local units of government and regional planning commissions for planning activities, including contracting for planning consultant services; costs of public planning sessions, costs of planning outreach and education activities; purchase of planning software or computerized planning data; or purchase of hardware necessary for use of planning software or computerized planning data.
- Require a 20% local match for grant awards.
- Require that distributions from the DOA planning grants appropriation be contingent on DOT concurrence in an expenditure plan.



16.952 Planning grants to local governmental units. (1) In this section, "local governmental unit" means a county, city, village, town or regional planning commission.

(2) From the appropriation under s. 20.505 (1) (ki), the department may provide grants to local governmental units to be used to finance the cost of planning activities, including contracting for planning consultant services, public planning sessions and other planning outreach and educational activities, or for the purchase of computerized planning data, planning software or the hardware required to utilize that data or software. Kirsten Grinde:

The federal funds that the department of administration (DOA) will use to award grants under this draft are presumably limited by federal law to transportation—related planning purposes. This draft does not limit the planning purposes for which DOA may award grants to "transportation—related" planning. That is, DOA may inadvertently award grants contrary to the permitted uses of those federal funds. However, under the draft DOA may not award a grant unless the secretary of transportation approves the award. The secretary of transportation must ensure that the award is not contrary to federal law.

Do you want to include a provision in this draft limiting the awards of federal transportation—related funds for only transportation—related purposes?
