We are looking to use three non-statutory provisions to establish three grants of one-time federal and matching moneys from Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) to Department of Justice (DOJ) for DNA equipment and databank conversion. They are:

1. Lab equipment replacement and maintenance. Non-statutory language could read:

From federal and program revenue moneys appropriated to the department of administration for the office of justice assistance under section 20.505(6)(h) of the statures, as affected by this act, and section 20.505(6)(pc) of the statutes, the department shall expend \$275,000 one-time funding in fiscal year 1999-2000 and \$400,000 one-time funding in fiscal year 2000-2001 to provide the department of justice with funding for the purchase, maintenance, and replacement of crime lab equipment, as affected by this act.

2. STR equipment. Non-statutory language could read:

From federal and program revenue moneys appropriated to the department of administration for the office of justice assistance under section 20.505(6)(h) of the statures, as affected by this act, and section 20.505(6)(pc) of the statutes, the department shall expend \$226,800 one-time funding in fiscal year 1999-2000 to provide the department of justice with funding for the purchase of equipment to implement the new DNA analytical technique known as short tandem repeat (STR), as affected by this act. The amounts in the schedule to provide grants for weed and seed projects under s. 165.982 and for law enforcement technology under s. 165.983.

3. DNA databank conversion. Non-statutory language could read:

From federal and program revenue moneys appropriated to the department of administration for the office of justice assistance under section 20.505(6)(h) of the statutes, as affected by this act, and section 20.505(6)(pc) of the statutes, the department shall expend \$450,000 one-time funding in fiscal year 1999-2000 to provide the department of justice with funding for outsourcing the conversion of the existing DNA databank to the new STR technology, as affected by this act.

I have modeled these provisions after OJA's commitment to provide funding for assistant DAs in Milwaukee under non-statutory section 9101.

References to 20.505(6)(h) must be updated to reflect the renumbering of the For comp. (a appropriation to 20.505(6)(kt) in draft # 1265/1.

References to DNA in 20.505(6)(h) may be eliminated. Twenty-six program areas tied to the Byrne anti-drug money determine the use of these OJAadministered funds. These mandates include not only drugs, but also DNA, domestic violence, anti-terrorism, etc. Since PL 99-570 already defines those purposes, we do not need them in our statutes. When 20.505(6)(h) was renumbered (6)(kt) without reference to DNA, that is acceptable. References to DNA in 20.455(2)(k) may also be eliminated.

Dollar amounts in Section 9101(1) Purchase, replacement and maintenance of state crime lab equipment need to be reduced to \$254,700 per fiscal year. This change was originally sent to you in an e-mail dated Thursday, January 14.

Please include the verbiage provided below in all non-statutory directives regarding OJA-administered funding.
