This provision assumes the six year reissue cycle will begin July 1, 2006 and should be effective with enactment of the budget. The reissue period should take place over six years so that DOT replaces license plates in these categories when individual plates reach six years old.

JUSTIFICATION:

A consistent replacement cycle for license plates will assure the department addresses concerns related to aging plates that may be difficult for law enforcement and others to read.
