DRAFTING INSTRUCTIONS

KINSHIP CARE ENTITLEMENT

Background

S. 48.57(3m)(am) requires the Department of Health and Family Services to reimburse counties, from appropriations s. 20.435(3)(cz) and (kc), for payments of \$215 per month to a kinship care relative who is providing care and maintenance for a child if certain conditions are met.

Confusion now exists as to whether the kinship care payment is entitlement. Some argue that the language under s. 48.57(3m)(am) makes the payment an entitlement. Others argue that the payments are constrained by the amounts in the Chapter 20 schedule and thus waiting lists for the payment can occur if requests exceed the funding ans of the abbushions levels in Chapter 20. , have 5,20,43 } 13)(17)+(kc)

Requested Change

Amend s. 48.57(3m) to clarify that the kinship care payment is not entitlement. This may be able to be accomplished by either of the following:

1. Amend s. 48 57(3m)(am) to add the phrase "within the limits of available state and federal funds; or (sh) (am) (in tra)

2. Use the type of language in s. 49.141(4) which provides that Wisconsin Works (W2) is not an entitlement.

Upon further consideration and budget developments:


During the FY99/01 biennium kinship care benefits will be completely funded with federal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) funds from the Department of Workforce Development. Because there will be some unallocated TANF funds, counties could argue that funds are available over and above the amounts that the Department of Health and Family Services allocates for the benefit.

To ensure that the kinship care benefit is not an entitlement, we will need language similar to s. 49.141(4).
