Please draft language which would allow the School for the Deaf and the School for the Visually Handicapped to participate in TEACH Wisconsin's telecommunications access program. The two residential schools would be able to receive the same data or video line subsidies as school districts, public libraries, CESAs, private schools, private colleges and universities and technical colleges. A separate appropriation will have to be created in TEACH for this purpose. (DPI has already submitted a similar drafting request for this initiative.)

Finally, under current law, the TEACH board makes subsidized loans to school districts and public library boards that may be used only for the purpose of upgrading and installing computer network wiring. Under this bill, federated and consolidated public library systems may also receive such loans. In addition, public library boards and federated and consolidated public library systems may also use the loans to purchasing hardware that is necessary for direct connection to the internet.
