Two additional items related to HEAB require drafting at this point.

1.) Under current law, students attending tribal colleges are eligible to receive grants under the Tuition Grant (TG) program. Statutory language drafted for inclusion in the biennial budget, LRB-0648/1, would exclude students attending tribal colleges from the FG program.

Please draft language that creates a separate higher education grant program specifically for students attending tribal colleges. The "Tribal College Higher Education Grant" should be patterned on the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG) program under s. 39.435, (i.e. similar minimum and maximum grant awards, formula determination, etc.). The program would be funded from a new PR-S continuing appropriation that would receive funds transferred from the Indian gaming receipts appropriation created under s. 20.505 (8) (hm)

The effective date of the provision should be July 1, 2000.

2.) Please draft language that changes the funding source of the Indian Student Assistance (ISA) grant program under s. 39.38. Currently ISA grants are funded 99-6 6 from a GPR biennial appropriation under s. 20.235 (1) (fb). The funding source

for the program should be changed to a PR-S continuing appropriation that would receive funds transferred from the Indian gaming receipts appropriation

created under s. 20.505 (8) (hm).

The effective date of the provision should be July 1, 2000.


