#### DRIVER IMPROVEMENT SURCHARGE

### Background

Under current law the Secretary of Administration must annually transfer 31.29% of the revenues credited to the appropriation under s. 20.435(6)(hx) to the appropriation under s. 20.395(5)(di).

### Requested Change

- 1. Repeal the provision that requires the transfer of 31.29% of the revenues to s. 20.395(5)(di). The Secretary of Administration, after consulting with agency heads, will annually transfer revenues to s. 20.435(7)(hy), s. 20.255(1)(hm), s. 20.285(1)(ia), s. 20.395(5)(ci), and s. 20.395(5)(di) and s. 20.455(5)(h).
- 2. In a nonstatutory provision require the Secretary of Administration to lapse to the general fund, in FY00, \$850,000 of the revenues credited to s. 20.435(6)(hx).

Currently, 31.29 % of all moneys received by the state that is collected as a driver improvement surcharge from persons convicted of driving while under the influence of an intoxicant is transferred to an appropriation account to pay for chemical testing and services. The secretary of administration, after consulting with the secretaries of health and family services and transportation, the superintendent of public instruction, the attorney general and the president of the University of Wisconsin system transfers the remaining moneys collected by the state as a driver improvement surcharge to programs related to drunk driving, such as for the purchase of breath screening devices. Under this bill, the separate 31.29% transfer is deleted and the chemical testing and services program is eligible for funding tracker approved by the secretary of administration, after consultation, as are the other drunk-driving related programs.

## **D**RIVERS AND MOTOR VEHICLES

Currently, 31.29% of all moneys received by the state as a driver improvement surcharge from persons convicted of driving while under the influence of an intoxicant is transferred to an appropriation account to pay for chemical testing and services. The secretary of administration, after consulting with the secretaries of health and family services and transportation, the superintendent of public instruction, the attorney general and the president of the University of Wisconsin (UW) System, transfers the remaining driver improvement surcharge moneys received by the state to programs related to drunk driving, such as for the purchase of breath screening devices. Under this bill, the separate 31.29% transfer is deleted and the chemical testing and services program is eligible for a funding transfer approved by the secretary of administration, after consultation, as are the other drunk-driving-related programs.
