DRAFTING INSTRUCTIONS
INDIAN GAMING INITIATIVE

Requested Changes

1. Under current law general purpose revenues (GPR) under s. 20.435(7)(dL) and federal revenues under s. 20.435(7)(o) fund the Delivery of services to American Indians program under s. 46.70. The GPR funding is to be replaced with Indian gaming revenues.

In creating a PR-S appropriation under s. 20.435(7) LRB has suggested the following language: "The amounts in the schedule to facilitate delivery of social and mental hygiene services to American Indians under s. 46.70. All moneys transferred from the appropriation under s. 20.505(8)(xx) shall be credited to this appropriation account.

2. Under current law general purpose revenues (GPR) under s. 20.435(7)(dm) fund the American Indian drug abuse prevention, treatment and education program under s. 46.71. The GPR funding is to be replaced with Indian gaming revenues.

In creating a PR-S appropriation under s. 20.435(7) LRB has suggested the following language: "The amounts in the schedule for American Indian drug abuse prevention, treatment and education program under s. 46.71. All moneys transferred from the appropriation under s. 20.505(8)(xx) shall be credited to this appropriation account.
