Please draft the following items for possible inclusion in the Governor's 1999-01 biennial budget bill:

Repeal the current Head start supplement appropriation (s. 20.255 (2)(eh)), effective June 30, 1999, and create a new appropriation under s. 20.255 (2), effective July 1, 1999 for the Head start supplement. Maintain the current reference under the new Ch. 20 appropriation to s.115.3615.
