<u>Background</u>

Statute: PL 103-382 Improve America' Schools Act (IASA), Title III Technology

Source: U.S. Department of Education

Purposes:

- To implement the Wisconsin Technology Plan PK-12

To implement local school district instructional technology plans

To accomplish the President's four goals (pillars)

1. All teachers will be training and support they need to help students learn through computers and the information superhighway.

2. All teachers and students will have modern computers in their classrooms.

3. Every classroom will be connected to the information superhighway.

Effective and engaging software and online learning resources will be an integral part of every school curriculum.

Y 1999 Wisconsin Allocation and Focus

• 56 8 million is expected for Wicconsin

Project need must be identified in the district technology plan

· Wisconsin applications may address hardware, software, or professional development, NOT connectivity

· At least 70% of the total budget request in an application must be for professional development

· Professional development must have an emphasis on integrating technology into curriculum and must be used in the classroom

Hardware and software purchased must relate to the professional development project

· Projects must be related to local or state information and technology literacy standards

Eligibility and Distribution

· Competitive grants to LEAs only, with consortia and partnerships encouraged (a consortium is made up of two or more districts)

· Maximum funding for single districts will be \$100,000; for consortiums \$250,000

· Milwaukee Public Schools may receive up to 15% of distributable funds if an acceptable application is

· Forty (40) % of the distributable funds will be awarded to districts with a high level of students in poverty based on the Title I concentration grants

• TLCF FY 1997 and 1998 grantees are eligible to apply for FY 1999 funds

• TLCF FY 1998 applicants scoring above 70 points will not automatically be funded

Application

- Must contain all requirements in Sections 3134 and 3135 of the statute
- · Must include one copy of the district's certified technology plan
- Must include one copy of the technology plan certification letter

Other

All contact persons must have email by the start of newly funded projects, July 1, 1999

· Districts funded in prior years that are not submitting an application, must provide at least one reader

<u>Timeline</u>

Applications are due to DPI January 29, 1999

- · Prescreening and grant application review will be completed by March 15, 1999
- Grants will be awarded by May 1, 1999
- Projects begin July 1, 1999

Projects will be completed by June 30, 2000

- Project Performance Reports will be due to DPI by August 1, 2000
- · DPI Performance Report will be due to US DOE by Sept. 30, 2000

PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

This bill directs the state superintendent of public instruction to consult with the technology for educational achievement in Wisconsin board (TEACH) before awarding school technology resource grants. School technology resource grants are funded with federal moneys and are awarded to school districts for various educational technology purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

2 Section 1. 115.28 (25) of the statutes is created to read:

115.28 (25) SCHOOL TECHNOLOGY RESOURCE GRANTS. Consult with the technology for educational achievement in Wisconsin board before awarding school technology resource grants under 20 USC 6842.
