Contracts with state agencies. The amounts in the schedule for contracts with state agencies shall be credited to this appropriation.

(b) Insurance and other information, counseling and assistance. The amounts in the schedule for the purpose of providing information and counseling on medicare supplemental insurance, long-term care insurance and medical assistance eligibility requirements, training, educational materials and technical assistance under s. 16.009 (2) (j). The office of the commissioner of insurance shall credit to this appropriation amounts equal to the amounts in the schedule for the purposes of this paragraph, from appropriation under s. 20.145 (1) (g). Notwithstanding s. 20.001 (3) (a), the unencumbered balance on June 30 of each fiscal year shall revert to the appropriation under s. 20.145 (1) (g).

From all moneys received under s. 69.22 (1) (c), the amounts in the schedule to be used for the expenses of the child abuse and neglect prevention board under s. 48.982 (2) and (3), for the general program operations of the early childhood family education center grant program under s. 48.982 (6) and the right from the start program under s. 48.982 (7) and for technical assistance to right from the start grant recipients under s. 48.982 (7) (a)

(h) Grants to organizations. All moneys received under s. 69.22 (1) (c), less the amounts appropriated under par. (g), to be used for grants to organizations under s. 48.982 (4), (6) and (7).

(i) Gifts and grants. All moneys received as contributions, gifts, grants and bequests, other than moneys received for the children's trust fund and deposited in the appropriation accounts

under pars. (q) and (r), to carry out the purposes for which made and received.

(k) Interagency programs. All moneys received from other state agencies to carry out the purposes for which received.

(m) Federal project operations. All moneys received from the federal government for the state administration of specific limited term projects to be expended for the purposes specified.

(ma) Federal project aids. All moneys received from the federal government for early childhood family education center grants under s. 48.982 (6) (a), and for specific limited term projects, to be expended as aids to individuals or organizations for the purposes specified.

(q) Children's trust fund grants. From the children's trust fund, all moneys received as contributions, grants, gifts and bequests for that trust fund under s. 48.982 (2) (d), less the amounts appropriated under par. (r), to carry out the purposes for which made and received under s. 48.982 (2m) (a).

(r) Children's trust fund; general program operations and statewide projects. From the children's trust fund, the amounts in the schedule for actual and necessary operating costs of the child abuse and neglect prevention board under s. 48.982 (3) and for statewide projects under s. 48.982 (5).

20.434 Adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board. There is appropriated to the adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board for the following program:

(1) ADOLESCENT PREGNANCY PREVENTION AND PREGNANCY SERVICES. (a) General program operations. The amounts in the schedule for the general program operations of the adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board under s. 46.93 (3) and 1995 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9102 (1z).

(b) Grants to organizations. The amounts in the schedule for grants to organizations under ss. 46.93 (2) and 46.935 (5).

(ka) Information technology development projects. The amounts in the schedule for the purpose of conducting information technology development projects approved under s. 16.971 (5). All moneys transferred from the appropriation account under s. 20.870 (1) (q), (r) or (s) shall be credited to this appropriation account.

20.435 Health and family services, department of. There is appropriated to the department of health and family services for the following programs:

(1) HEALTH SERVICES PLANNING, REGULATION AND DELIVERY. (a) General program operations. The amounts in the schedule for general program operations, including health services regulation, administration and field services.

(am) Services, reimbursement and payment related to acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. The amounts in the schedule for the purchase of services under s. 252.12 (2) (a) for individuals with respect to acquired immunodeficiency syndrome and related infections, to subsidize premium payments under ss. 252.16 and 252.17 and to reimburse or supplement the reimbursement of the cost of AZT, pentamidine and certain other drugs under s. 49.686.

(b) Medical assistance program benefits. Biennially, the amounts in the schedule to provide the state share of medical assistance program benefits administered under s. 49.45, to provide medical assistance program benefits administered under s. 49.45 that are not also provided under par. (o), to provide health care coverage under s. 49.153 and to fund the pilot project under s. 46.27 (9) and (10). Notwithstanding s. 20.002 (1), the department may transfer from this appropriation to the appropriation under sub. (3) (kb) funds in the amount of and for the purposes specified in s. 46.485. Notwithstanding ss. 20.001 (3) (b) and 20.002 (1), the department may credit or deposit into this appro-

the department shall impose any additional safeguards to prevent unwarranted disclosure of information.

Pursuant to lawful order of a court of record.

To any agency or individual that provides direct services under sub. (5m). Information obtained under this subdivision shall remain confidential.

To the guardian of the elder person or the guardian of any person named in a report who is suspected of abusing or neglecting an elder person. These persons may inspect the report on the investigation, except that information identifying the person who initially reported the suspected abuse, material abuse, neglect or self-neglect may not be released.

To law enforcement officials in accordance with the policy developed under sub. (3) (a).

(c) 1. Any person, including the state or any political subdivision of the state, violating this subsection shall be liable to any person damaged as a result of the violation for such damages as may be proved, together with exemplary damages of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 for each violation and such costs and reasonable actual attorney fees as may be incurred by the person damaged. A custodian of records incurs no liability under this subdivision for the release of records in accordance with this subsection while acting in good faith.

2. In any action brought under subd. 1. in which the court determines that the violator acted in a manner that was knowing and wilful, the violator shall be liable for such damages as may be proved together with exemplary damages of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 for each violation, together with costs and reasonable actual attorney fees as may be incurred. It is not a prerequisite to an action under this paragraph that the plaintiff suffer or be threatened with actual damages.

3. An individual may bring an action to enjoin any violation of this subsection or to compel compliance with this subsection, and may in the same action seek damages as provided in this paragraph. The individual may recover costs and reasonable actual attorney fees as may be incurred in the action, if he or she prevails.

(d) Any person who requests or obtains confidential information under this subsection under false pretenses may be fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned not more than one year in the county jail or both.

(e) Any employe who violates this subsection may be subject to discharge or suspension without pay.

(7) EXCEPTION. Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean that a person is abused, neglected or in need of direct or protective services solely because he or she consistently relies upon treatment by spiritual means through prayer for healing in accordance with his or her religious tradition.

(8) DEPARTMENT DUTIES. (a) The department shall develop a plan to assist county agencies in determining appropriate responses to reports of abuse, material abuse, neglect or self-neglect.

(b) The department shall prepare and distribute sample report forms for use by county agencies.

(c) The department shall collect statistical information from each county pertaining to each reported case of abuse, material abuse, neglect or self-neglect. The department may require investigators to submit statements to the department that summarize the information being reported. These summary statements may not name or otherwise identify individual persons. The department shall use this information to review the effectiveness of this section, to plan program changes and to formulate reports.

(d) The department shall develop and disseminate information on elder abuse and the elder abuse reporting system under this section. The department shall also develop informational materials to be used by county agencies regarding elder abuse and the elder abuse reporting system. The department shall solicit contribu-

tions of labor, materials and expertise from private sources to assist in developing the informational materials.

46.93 Adolescent pregnancy prevention programs and pregnancy services.

(1) LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The legislature finds that the 1,100,000 annual unintended or unwanted adolescent pregnancies in the United States, as estimated by the federal national center for health statistics, is a tragic and undesirable consequence of complex societal problems. The legislature recognizes that there is a lack of adequate health care, education, counseling and vocational training for adolescents which may provide positive options to adolescents in the area of pregnancy and parenting. To reduce the incidence, and adverse consequences, of adolescent pregnancy, the legislature finds that adolescent pregnancy prevention programs and pregnancy services are essential to encourage and implement community programs which address the complex societal problems facing adolescents and provide positive options to adolescent pregnancy.

(1m) DEFINITIONS. In this section:

(a) "Adolescent" means a person under the age of 18 years.

(b) "Board" means the adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board under s. 15.195 (5).

(c) "Nonprofit corporation" means a nonstock, nonprofit corporation organized under ch. 181.

(d) "Organization" means a nonprofit corporation or a public agency which provides or proposes to provide adolescent pregnancy prevention programs or pregnancy services or both.

(e) "Public agency" means a county, city, village, town or school district or an agency of this state or of a county, city, village, town or school district.

(2) PURPOSE, ALLOCATION. From the appropriation under s. 20.434 (1) (b), the board shall award not more than \$566,300 in fiscal year 1995-96 and not more than \$439,300 in fiscal year 1996-97 for grants to organizations to provide adolescent pregnancy prevention programs or pregnancy services that include health care, education, counseling and vocational training. Types of services and programs that are eligible for grants include all of the following:

- (a) Adolescent health clinics located in schools.
(b) A statewide communications media campaign to discourage adolescent sexual activity and encourage the assumption of responsibility by adolescents, including male adolescent responsibility, for their sexual activity and for parenting.
(c) Adoption counseling for adolescents.
(d) Residential facilities for pregnant adolescents.
(e) Adult role model programs for adolescents.

(2m) MATCHING FUNDS REQUIRED. (a) Each organization that receives a grant under this section shall provide matching funds equal to 20% of the grant amount awarded. The match may be in the form of money or in-kind services or both, but any moneys used by an organization toward a match may not include moneys received from the state government.

(b) Each grant application shall include proof of the organization's ability to comply with par. (a). Any proposed match under par. (a) that includes in-kind services is subject to the approval of the board.

(3) STAFF AND SALARIES. The salaries of the board staff and all actual and necessary operating expenses of the board shall be paid from the appropriation under s. 20.434 (1) (a).

(3m) LIMITATIONS ON GRANT AWARD AND USE. The board in awarding grants under sub. (2) may not disapprove an application from an applying organization solely because the applying organization has a religious affiliation. The following activities are prohibited under any grant award under sub. (2):
