- 1) The budget bill creates a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation to provide public broadcasting services on a privatized basis.
- 2) The ECB and the UW-Extension public broadcasting unit will remain intact until such time as the FCC and the IRS give their approval to the transfer of the licenses and the tax-exempt format, respectively. Upon the effective approval date of these two entities (whichever is later):
- The ECB and the UW-Extension broadcasting division will cease to exist.
- All licenses will transfer to the nonprofit corporation.
- Unencumbered funds at the ECB and the UW-Extension will be transferred to the nonprofit corporation's appropriations.
- Employes will either terminate as employes of the ECB and the UW-Extension, or will become employes of other state agencies. (This will be dependent on the report submitted to the joint committee on finance. See 3) below.)
- Appropriations at the UW and DPI will be activated.

[Note: The nonprofit corporation will need a number in the Ch. 20 schedule. It will also require appropriations. We've discussed 265 as the Ch. 20 number but we have not discussed the number of appropriations the nonprofit will need. One appropriation that will definitely be needed is one that will allow the board of directors to incur start-up costs.]

- 3) The budget will designate the Secretary of the Department of Administration (DOA) and two others appointed by the Governor to serve as a transition board. (DOA will provide all necessary staff services to the transition board.) The transition board will have the following responsibilities:
- Drafting the articles of incorporation.
- Preparing a report, in conjunction with DOA, that will specify how many
 employes and what level of state funding is needed to continue providing public
 broadcasting services upon transfer of the licenses to the nonprofit corporation.
 The report will also address how the nonprofit corporation can fund the

- 4) The transition board and DOA will submit the report to the joint committee on finance for its approval. If approval is given, the approved plan will become effective upon transfer of the licenses or IRS approval of tax-exempt status, whichever is later.
- 5) Once the transition board has articles of incorporation and an approved employe/funding plan, the transition board members will call for the first meeting of

the board of directors of the nonprofit corporation. Once the first meeting is completed, the transition board will disband and their role will be completed.

- 6) The board of directors:
- Will consist of nine members appointed by the Governor.
- Will draft by-laws for the nonprofit corporation, apply to the IRS for taxexempt status and apply to the FCC for the transfer of the licenses.
- Will negotiate a lease arrangement with the owners of existing public broadcasting towers (and related structures, equipment and property) for their continued use.

[Note #1: If the Governor appoints the board of directors on Day 1, how do we compel the board on Day 2 to maintain its current size and structure given that state aid for the nonprofit corporation will not start flowing until the licenses are transferred?]

[Note#2: In our discussions regarding bullet point #2, we (or I) suggested putting all this in statute. Isn't this redundant and unnecessary, as the board will have to do all of this just to move forward?]

[Note#3: In bullet point #3, I deliberately did not say that the state would be the owners of transmitters, etc. as we may be selling everything off. This may also be redundant and unnecessary to put in statute as the nonprofit corporation will have to do this anyway to broadcast.]

- 7) When the nonprofit corporation receives FCC and IRS effective approval dates, the "trigger mechanism" described in 2) on the previous page will take effect. Three things will occur:
- Licenses and unencumbered funding will transfer to the nonprofit corporation's appropriations (which will be "activated" by the effective date of approval). Employes will either terminate or be transferred to other agencies (as specified in the report to joint finance). As a condition of continued state aid, the nonprofit corporation will implement the joint finance-approved report on employes and funding.
- A single public broadcasting appropriation at the UW, created in the budget bill, will be activated. This appropriation will be used by the UW to "buy" programming and airtime from the nonprofit corporation.
- A single public broadcasting appropriation at DPI, created in the budget bill, will be activated. This appropriation will be used by DPI to "buy" programming and airtime from the nonprofit corporation.

- 8) As a condition of continued state aid, the nonprofit corporation will honor all existing public broadcasting contracts.
- 9) As a condition of continued state aid, the nonprofit corporation will be subject to open records laws, open meetings laws and audits by the Legislative Reference Bureau.
- As a condition of continued state aid, the nonprofit corporation will regotiate with Milwaukee Area Public Television for its entry into the nonprofit corporation, if it so desires.

11) If the nonprofit corporation fails to win FCC or IRS approval, no change would occur in the way in which public broadcasting is provided.

OTHER EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL AGENCIES

Under current law, the educational communications board (ECB) is responsible for overseeing and coordinating the provision of public broadcasting to Wisconsin. In addition, the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System (board), as licensee, must manage, operate and maintain a radio and television station and provide the ECB part—time use of equipment and space necessary for the operations of the state educational radio and television networks.

This bill directs the secretary of administration (secretary) and persons chosen by the governor to draft and file articles of incorporation for a nonstock educational broadcasting corporation that qualify the corporation for tax exempts status under the internal revenue code. In addition, the secretary and persons chosen by the governor must prepare and submit to the joint committee on finance for its approval an operational plan for the corporation that includes a list of those persons employed by the board and the ECB who are best-suited to provide educational broadcasting services for the corporation and an estimate of the level of funding necessary to cover the corporation's annual operating expenses.

The corporation is entitled to receive state aid for initial administrative expenses if the articles of incorporation of the corporation state that the purpose of the corporation is to provide educational broadcasting to Wisconsin and that, if the

corporation dissolves or discontinues educational broadcasting to Wisconsin, the corporation shall in good faith take all reasonable measures to transfer or assign the corporation's assets, licenses and rights to an entity whose purpose is to advance educational broadcasting in Wisconsin; the articles of incorporation name as initial directors the secretary, two state representatives to the assembly, two state senators, a member of the board and three individuals selected by the governor; the initial board of directors of the corporation submits an application to the federal communications commission (FCC) to transfer all broadcasting licenses held by ECB and the board to the corporation.

If the FCC approves the transfer of all broadcasting licenses held by the ECB and the board to the corporation, the ECB is eliminated on the effective date of the transfer of the broadcasting licenses. In addition, the corporation is entitled to receive additional state aid for operational expenses if the board of directors of the corporation offers employment beginning on the effective date of the transfer of all the broadcasting licenses to those individuals designated in the operational plan; the board of directors of the corporation honors affiliation agreements entered into by the educational communications beard; the board of directors of the corporation negotiates with the board and the secretary for the use of state—owned equipment and space necessary for the operations of educational radio and television networks; the secretary approves any amendment to the corporation's articles of incorporation or bylaws: **INSERT A**

OTHER EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL AGENCIES

Under current law, the educational communications board (FCB) is responsible for overseeing and coordinating the provision of public broadcasting to Wisconsin. In addition, the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System (board), as licensee, must manage, operate and maintain a radio and television station and provide the ECB part—time use of equipment and space necessary for the operations of the state educational radio and television networks.

This bill directs the secretary of administration (secretary), and the persons chosen by the governor to draft and file articles of incorporation for a nonstock educational broadcasting corporation and to take all actions necessary to exempt the corporation from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the secretary and persons chosen by the governor must prepare and submit to the joint committee on finance (JCF) for JCF's approval an operational plan for the corporation that includes a list of those persons employed by the board and the ECB who are best-suited to provide educational broadcasting services for the corporation and an estimate of the level of funding necessary to cover the corporation's annual operating expenses.

The corporation is entitled to receive state aid for initial administrative expenses if the articles of incorporation of the corporation state that the purpose of

the corporation is to provide educational broadcasting to Wisconsin and that, if the corporation dissolves or discontinues educational broadcasting to Wisconsin, the corporation must in good faith take all reasonable measures to transfer or assign the corporation's assets, licenses and rights to an entity whose purpose is to advance educational broadcasting in Wisconsin; the articles of incorporation name as initial directors the secretary, two state representatives to the assembly, two state senators, a member of the board and three individuals selected by the governor; and the initial board of directors of the corporation submits an application to the federal communications commission (FCC) to transfer all broadcasting licenses held by ECB and the board to the corporation.

If the FCC approves the transfer of all broadcasting licenses held by the ECB and the board to the corporation, the ECB is eliminated on the effective date of the transfer of the broadcasting licenses. In addition, the corporation is entitled to receive additional state aid for operational expenses if the board of directors of the corporation offers employment beginning on the effective date of the transfer of all of the broadcasting licenses to those individuals designated in the operational plan; the board of directors of the corporation honors affiliation agreements entered into by the ECB the board of directors of the corporation negotiates with the board and the secretary for the use of state—owned equipment and space necessary for the operations of educational radio and television networks; the secretary approves any amendment to the corporation's articles of incorporation or bylaws; the corporation permits public access to its records to the same extent as required of a state agency; the corporation provides public notice of and permits public access to its meetings to the same extent as required of a state agency; and the corporation provides employes of the legislative audit bureau with access to all of its records.
