Please draft a statutory language change to allow for the governor to contract with special counsel and to set a maximum amount of compensation from the Department of Justice's sum sufficient appropriation for special counsel. This would modify s. 20.455 (1)(b). This was a policy of the governor in the 1991-93 budget, but the location of the draft language from that budget cannot be found. GOVERNOR/LEGISLATURE: Consolidate two GPR appropriations for ethics and lobbying regulation and reduce the base by \$3,400 annually. Expand program revenue appropriation language for use of lobbying regulation fees to allow such fees to be used for general program operations of the agency. Expand the appropriation for gifts and grants to allow use of contributions for either ethics law or lobby law regulation activities.

[Act 39 Sections: 618 thru 624]

7. FUNDING FOR INVESTIGATIONS [LFB PAPER 126]

GOVERNOR: Change current law to permit the Governor, upon request of the Ethics Board, to appoint special counsel to assist in investigating and prosecuting alleged violations of lobby or ethics laws. The Governor would contract with the special counsel and set a maximum amount of compensation that would be paid from the Department of Justice's sum sufficient appropriation for special counsel. No estimated increase in expenditures for this purpose has been included in DOJ's special counsel appropriation.


