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

All money received from state agencies for state operations shall be credited to this appropriation.

The goal here is to have a means for funding the costs of projects in Office of the Governor which are undertaken in the Office and which involve the programs and policies of other state agencies. For example, we intend to request in this appropriation a position to assist the Governor in rail transportation policies the costs of which will be billed to the Department of Transportation by mutual agreement.

If we must transfer functions completely and perhaps permanently, the draft would have to be much more detailed.
- 2. A common string attached to the receipt of federal moneys by this state is to require the governor or legislature to designate a *single* state agency to administer the moneys. If the governor's office assists with policy development, research or advice on program implementation I would not think this would pose a problem, but I don't know how sticky the federal agencies might be on this. In any event, I think it would probably pose a problem with the single agency requirement if we had actual joint administration of a program.
