We need to create some additional non-statutory language to direct the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) to provide funding for items recommended in the budget. We already have similar non-statutory provisions directing OJA to provide funding for DOJ's crime labs and DNA equipment and drug prosecutors in Dane and Milwaukee counties.

This request is for the creation of non-statutory language directing OJA to fund BJIS equipment installation, BJIS operations, drug abuse programming at DOC, and DOC's information technology needs.



The secretary of administration shall allocate \$533,300 in fiscal year 1999–2000 and \$1,200,000 in fiscal year 2000–01 from the appropriation accounts under section 20.505 (6) (h) and (pc) of the statutes to provide the department of corrections with funding for information technology.

(5) Reimbursement to counties for crime victim and witness services. The secretary of administration shall allocate \$850,800 in fiscal year 1999–2000 and \$850,800 in fiscal year 2000–01 from the appropriation accounts under section 20.505 (6) (g) and (pb) of the statutes to provide reimbursement to counties for providing services to victims and witnesses of crime.
