Subject: Amendment to 1846/1 Appropriation Transfer for emergency management services

The subject draft, as is, transfers \$177,400 from a continuing GPR appropriation in FY00 in Military Affairs to an existing sum certain annual GPR appropriation in the same agency. Upon further analysis, we find that the contributing appropriation has zero budgeted in the base, therefore, it would not be correct to "transfer" the funds, but rather to lapse this amount to the general fund. Technically, to transfer the funds would require an appropriation, which sets up a double count of the GPR spending. Therefore, could you please revise this draft to mandate the lapse of \$177,400 from 465(3) (dr) to the general fund? We will ensure that the receiving appropriation under s.465(3)(dd) receives the same amount in the schedule under Governor's recommendations.

Note to Monty: You'll need to itemize this as a lapse or other wise account for it as an offset in the GFCS or there will be a spurious net hit on the ending balance.
