RE: Retailer support for uniform Synar compliance checks

We represent over 15,000 Wisconsin retailers who sell tobacco products and want to do everything in our power to prevent sales to underage persons. We all support and participate in the We Card program in Wisconsin which educates retailers and their employees on how to prevent underage tobacco sales. We are committed to being a part of the solution to the issue of access to tobacco by underage persons.

As the Governor considers his 1999-2000 biennial budget we would support inclusion of statutory language relating to statewide protocol for a licensing authority or law enforcement agency as they conduct underage compliance checks as required by the Synar Retailer Tobacco Compliance Check Survey rule. Wisconsin retailers want to be on the front lines of this effort and strongly support this proactive effort to curb access to tobacco products by underage persons.

Under the federal Synar requirements Wisconsin is required to conduct statewide compliance surveys to determine the prevalence of illegal retail sales of tobacco products to underage persons. Wisconsin conducted it first annual Synar Retail Tobacco Compliance Check in 1997.

The Bureau of Substance Abuse Services at the Department of Health and Family Services has developed compliance check protocol per federal guidelines provided by the Center for Substance Abuse Services. However, no legal procedural compliance check protocol currently exist in Wisconsin. We support a statewide standard protocol for compliance checks to continue to qualify for federal funding while at the same time securing accurate statewide information related to underage sales of tobacco by Wisconsin retailers to gauge if our education of retailers and employees is working.

We support a state law which would establish a procedure to be followed when conducting compliance checks. We believe by establishing statewide protocol the Department of Health and Family services will be able to gather accurate information to comply with the federal Synar requirements. Our proposal would require the following:

\* the licensing authority shall enlist a minor over the age of 15, but under the age of 18 to conduct compliance checks. The licensing authority must obtain the written consent of exclude the minor's parent or legal guardies before the minor participates in the compliance checks;

- \* the minor participating in a compliance check shall act solely under the supervision and direction of the licensing authority or law enforcement agency conducting the compliance check:
- \* before and following each compliance check or shift of compliance checks, the licensing authority or law enforcement agency conducting the compliance check shall take a photograph of all minors who participated in the checks to verify the minor's appearance. The licensing authority shall retain each photograph taken under this provision for at least two years:
- \* if the minor participating in the inspection is questioned about the minor's age while conducting a compliance check, the minor shall state his/her actual age and end the compliance check:
- \* the appearance of the minor who is participating in the compliance check shall not be altered in order to attempt to make the person appear to be 18 years of age or older;
- \* the licensing authority or law enforcement agency conducting the compilance check must inform the retail location and individual who made the sale within one haur of a failed compliance check. The licensing authority or law enforcement agency must show the individual who made the sale the photograph of the minor used in the compliance check at the same time the individual is being informed of the failed compliance check;

exclude

- if the licensing authority, law enforcement agency or minor conducting the compliance check fails to meet all of the requirements for conducting compliance checks, no citation shall be issued or fine imposed for any violations of compliance; and
- \* If a licensing agency or law enforcement agency conducts a compliance check and finds no violations of compliance the law enforcement agency or licensing authority which conducted the compliance check must send written notice within five days to the retail location informing the location that a compliance check had been conducted and that no violations occurred.

The benefits of these protocol provide the necessary statewide uniformity to compile the necessary data and information needed to comply with Synar Requirements and ensure Wisconsin continues to receive its full amount of funding from the substance abuse block grant. We pledge to work with the Administration to continue to keep tobacco products out of the mouths of underage persons.
