7 (1) POSITION AUTHORIZATION.

8 (a) Notwithstanding section 16.505 (1) of the statutes, during the 1999–2001
9 biennium, the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System may propose
10 to increase its authorized FTE positions that are funded, in whole or in part, with
11 general purpose revenues by not more than 1% above the level authorized for the
12 board under section 16.505 (1) of the statutes. The board shall submit any proposal
13 under this subsection to the secretaries of administration and employment relations
14 for approval, together with its methodology for accounting for the cost of funding
15 these positions. The secretaries of administration and employment relations may
16 only approve a proposal if the incremental costs for these positions, as determined
17 by the secretaries of administration and employment relations, are not to be included
18 in any subsequent request submitted by the board under section 16.42 (1) of the
19 statutes. If the secretaries of administration and employment relations jointly
20 approve the proposal, the positions are authorized.

21 (b) During the 1999–2001 biennium, the board may not include in any
22 certification to the department of administration under section 20.928 (1) of the
23 statutes any sum to pay any costs of a position authorized under this subsection.

24 (c) No later than the last day of the month following completion of each calendar
25 quarter, the board shall report to the secretaries of administration and employment

1 relations concerning the number of authorized positions under this subsection that
2 have been filled by the board during the preceding calendar quarter and the source
3 of funding for each such position.

6 (1) UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN CENTER FOR TOBACCO RESEARCH AND INTERVENTION.
7 The board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System shall allocate \$1,000,000
8 in fiscal year 1999-2000 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 from the
9 appropriation under section 20.285 (1) (a) of the statutes, as affected by this act, to
10 advance the work of the University of Wisconsin center for tobacco research and
11 intervention in developing new educational programs to discourage tobacco use,
12 determining the most effective strategies for preventing tobacco use and expanding
13 smoking cessation programs throughout the state.

25 under section 49.175 (1) (vL) without participating in a competitive process.

3 (1) GOVERNOR'S WORK-BASED LEARNING BOARD.

4 (a) *Assets and liabilities.* On the effective date of this paragraph, the assets and
5 liabilities of the department of workforce development primarily related to the
6 functions of the division of connecting education and work, as determined by the
7 secretary of administration, shall become the assets and liabilities of the governor's
8 work-based learning board.

9 (b) *Employe transfers.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all positions in
10 the department of workforce development that are primarily related to the division
11 of connecting education and work and the incumbent employes holding those
12 positions, as determined by the secretary of administration, are transferred to the
13 governor's work-based learning board.

14 (c) *Employe status.* Employes transferred under paragraph (b) have all the
15 rights and the same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the
16 statutes in the governor's work-based learning board that they enjoyed in the
17 division of connecting education and work in the department of workforce
18 development immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4)
19 of the statutes, no employe so transferred who has attained permanent status in
20 class is required to serve a probationary period.

21 (d) *Tangible personal property.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all
22 tangible personal property, including records, of the department of workforce
23 development that is primarily related to the functions of the division of connecting

1 education and work, as determined by the secretary of administration, is transferred
2 to the governor's work-based learning board.

3 (e) *Pending matters.* Any matter pending with the department of workforce
4 development on the effective date of this paragraph that is primarily related to the
5 division of connecting education and work, as determined by the secretary of
6 administration, is transferred to the governor's work-based learning board. All
7 materials submitted to or actions taken by the department of workforce development
8 with respect to the pending matter are considered as having been submitted to or
9 taken by the governor's work-based learning board.

10 (f) *Contracts.* All contracts entered into by the department of workforce
11 development in effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily
12 related to the functions of the division of connecting education and work, as
13 determined by the secretary of administration, remain in effect and are transferred
14 to the governor's work-based learning board. The governor's work-based learning
15 board shall carry out any obligations under those contracts unless modified or
16 rescinded by the governor's work-based learning board to the extent allowed under
17 the contract.

18 (g) *Rules and orders.* All rules promulgated by the department of workforce
19 development in effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily
20 related to the division of connecting education and work remain in effect until their
21 specified expiration date or until amended or repealed by the governor's work-based
22 learning board. All orders issued by the department of workforce development in
23 effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily related to the division
24 of connecting education and work remain in effect until their specified expiration
25 date or until modified or rescinded by the governor's work-based learning board.

3 (1) DANE COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION.

4 (a) Notwithstanding the composition of the membership of the Dane County
5 regional planning commission that is determined under section 66.945 (3) (b) of the
6 statutes and the terms for such regional planning commission members that are
7 determined under section 66.945 (3) (c) of the statutes, no commissioner of the Dane
8 County regional planning commission who holds office on the 30th day after the
9 effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date], may remain in his or her
10 office beyond that date unless he or she is reappointed under paragraph (b).

11 (b) Beginning on the 31st day after the effective date of this paragraph
12 [revisor inserts date], the Dane County regional planning commission shall consist
13 of the following members who shall be appointed by the governor from the lists
14 described under this paragraph or from the list described under paragraph (c), or
15 from a combination of the lists under this paragraph and paragraph (c):

16 1. Two members from a list of at least 4 names submitted by an association
17 representing towns that is in existence on January 1, 1999. One of the members
18 appointed under this subdivision shall reside in a town located in western Dane
19 County and the other member shall reside in a town that is located in eastern Dane
20 County.

21 2. Two members from a list of at least 4 names submitted jointly by an
22 association representing villages and by an association representing 3rd and 4th
23 class cities, both of which are in existence on January 1, 1999.

24 3. Two members from a list of at least 4 names submitted by the mayor of the
25 city of Madison.

1 4. Five members from a list of at least 8 Dane County board supervisors that
2 is submitted by the Dane County executive. From the list, at least 2 of the appointees
3 under this subdivision shall represent towns, no more than 2 of the appointees may
4 represent districts that are wholly or partially in the city of Madison, at least 2 of the
5 appointees shall represent districts in western Dane County and at least 2 of the
6 appointees shall represent districts in eastern Dane County.

7 (c) The governor may prepare a list of 5 individuals who shall have experience
8 in land use planning issues. The governor may make the appointments described
9 under paragraph (b) solely from the lists described under paragraph (b), or the
10 governor may make some of the appointments from the list created under this
11 paragraph.

12 (d) Notwithstanding the procedures for dissolution of a regional planning
13 commission that are specified under section 66.945 (15) of the statutes, the Dane
14 County regional planning commission shall be dissolved on December 31, 2001. All
15 unexpended funds of the commission on that date shall be applied to any outstanding
16 indebtedness of the commission. If any outstanding indebtedness of the commission
17 remains after the application of the unexpended funds to such debts, the remaining
18 indebtedness shall be assessed to Dane County. If the commission has no
19 outstanding indebtedness and has unexpended funds, such funds shall be returned
20 to the cities, villages, towns or county that supplied them.

21 (e) Not later than July 1, 2001, the county board of every county that is not in
22 a regional planning commission and that is adjacent to Dane County, and the Dane
23 County board, shall vote on whether to participate in a new regional planning
24 commission under section 66.945 of the statutes. Such a regional planning
25 commission shall be created, on January 1, 2002, if at least two-thirds of the county

1 boards that may vote under this paragraph vote to participate in the creation of such
2 a regional planning commission.

4 (1) ELIMINATION OF EDUCATIONAL APPROVAL BOARD.

5 (a) *Assets and liabilities.*

6 1. On the effective date of this subdivision, all assets and liabilities of the
7 educational approval board primarily related to the approval of veterans education
8 and training shall become the assets and liabilities of the department of veterans
9 affairs.

10 2. On the effective date of this subdivision, all assets and liabilities of the
11 educational approval board not specified in subdivision 1. shall become the assets
12 and liabilities of the higher educational aids board.

13 3. The department of veterans affairs and the higher educational aids board
14 shall jointly determine the assets and liabilities transferred under subdivisions 1.
15 and 2. and shall jointly develop and implement a plan for the orderly transfer of the
16 assets and liabilities. In the event of any disagreement between the department and
17 the board, the secretary of administration shall decide the question.

18 (b) *Employe transfers.*

19 1. On the effective date of this subdivision, 3.0 FTE PR-F positions in the
20 educational approval board, except for the executive secretary position, and the
21 incumbent employes holding those positions are transferred to the department of
22 veterans affairs.

23 2. On the effective date of this subdivision, 4.0 FTE PR positions and 1.0 FTE
24 PR project position in the educational approval board, except for the executive

1 secretary position, and the incumbent employes holding those positions are
2 transferred to the higher educational aids board.

3 3. The department of veterans affairs and the higher educational aids board
4 shall jointly determine the employes to be transferred under subdivisions 1. and 2.
5 and shall jointly develop and implement a plan for the orderly transfer of the
6 employes. In the event of any disagreement between the department and the board,
7 the secretary of administration shall decide the question.

8 (c) *Employe status.* Employes transferred under paragraph (b) have all the
9 rights and the same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the
10 statutes in the department of veterans affairs and the higher educational aids board
11 that they enjoyed in the educational approval board immediately before the transfer.
12 Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes, no employe so transferred who
13 has attained permanent status in class is required to serve a probationary period.

14 (d) *Tangible personal property.*

15 1. On the effective date of this subdivision, all tangible personal property,
16 including records, of the educational approval board primarily related to the
17 approval of veterans education and training is transferred to the department of
18 veterans affairs.

19 2. On the effective date of this subdivision, all tangible personal property,
20 including records, of the educational approval board that is not specified in
21 subdivision 1. is transferred to the higher educational aids board.

22 3. The department of veterans affairs and the higher educational aids board
23 shall jointly identify the tangible personal property, including records, and shall
24 jointly develop and implement a plan for the orderly transfer of the property. In the

1 event of any disagreement between the department and the board, the secretary of
2 administration shall decide the question.

3 (e) *Pending matters.* On the effective date of this paragraph, any matter
4 pending with the educational approval board that is primarily related to the
5 approval of veterans education and training is transferred to the department of
6 veterans affairs and any other pending matter is transferred to the higher
7 educational aids board. All materials submitted to or actions taken by the
8 educational approval board with respect to a pending matter are considered as
9 having been submitted to or taken by the department or the board to which the
10 matter was transferred under this paragraph.

11 (f) *Contracts.*

12 1. On the effective date of this subdivision, all contracts entered into by the
13 educational approval board primarily related to the approval of veterans education
14 and training, which are in effect on the effective date of this subdivision, remain in
15 effect and are transferred to the department of veterans affairs. The department of
16 veterans affairs shall carry out any such contractual obligations until modified or
17 rescinded by the department to the extent allowed under the contract.

18 2. On the effective date of this subdivision, all contracts entered into by the
19 educational approval board that are not specified in subdivision 1., which are in
20 effect on the effective date of this subdivision, remain in effect and are transferred
21 to the higher educational aids board. The higher educational aids board shall carry
22 out any such contractual obligations until modified or rescinded by the board to the
23 extent allowed under the contract.

24 3. The department of veterans affairs and the higher educational aids board
25 shall jointly identify the contracts specified in subdivisions 1. and 2. and shall jointly

1 develop and implement a plan for the orderly transfer of the contracts. In the event
2 of any disagreement between the department and the board, the secretary of
3 administration shall decide the question.

4 (g) *Rules and orders.*

5 1. All rules promulgated by the educational approval board that are in effect
6 on the effective date of this subdivision and that are primarily related to the approval
7 of veterans education and training remain in effect until their specified expiration
8 date or until amended or repealed by the department of veterans affairs. All orders
9 issued by the educational approval board that are in effect on the effective date of this
10 subdivision and that are primarily related to the approval of veterans education and
11 training remain in effect until their specified expiration date or until modified or
12 rescinded by the department of veterans affairs.

13 2. All rules promulgated by the educational approval board that are in effect
14 on the effective date of this subdivision and that are not specified in subdivision 1.
15 remain in effect until their specified expiration date or until amended or repealed by
16 the higher educational aids board. All orders issued by the educational approval
17 board that are in effect on the effective date of this subdivision and that are not
18 specified in subdivision 1. remain in effect until their specified expiration date or
19 until modified or rescinded by the higher educational aids board.

21 (1) CULTURAL ARTS AUTHORITY. The legislative reference bureau shall prepare
22 legislation authorizing the creation of cultural arts authorities in cities with a
23 population of at least 150,000, based on instructions provided by the department of
24 administration. The final instructions for this legislation shall be submitted to the
25 legislative reference bureau by the department of administration not later than

1 March 1, 1999. The secretary of administration shall submit the proposed legislation

4 (1) CONSOLIDATION OF STATE VEHICLE FLEET OPERATIONS.

5 (a) In this subsection:

6 1. "Department" means the department of administration.

7 2. "Secretary" means the secretary of administration.

8 (b) The department shall submit to the cochairpersons of the joint committee
9 on finance for consideration at the 4th quarterly meeting of the committee under
10 section 13.10 of the statutes to be held in 1999 an implementation plan for
11 consolidating the vehicle fleet management functions of the department of natural
12 resources with the corresponding functions of the department.

13 (c) The plan submitted under paragraph (b) may include provision for any of
14 the following on the effective date specified in the plan:

15 1. Transfer of the assets and liabilities of the department of natural resources
16 relating to its vehicle fleet management functions to the department.

17 2. Transfer of the tangible personal property, including records, of the
18 department of natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management functions
19 to the department.

20 3. Transfer to the department of any authorized full-time equivalent position
21 of the department of natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management
22 functions. The plan shall include identification of the numbers, revenue sources and
23 types of any positions to be transferred from the department of natural resources to
24 the department under the plan.

1 4. Transfer to the department of any incumbent employes holding positions in
2 the department of natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management
3 functions. Employes transferred under the plan have all the rights and the same
4 status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the statutes in the
5 department that they enjoyed in the department of natural resources immediately
6 before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes, no employe
7 so transferred who has attained permanent status in class is required to serve a
8 probationary period.

9 5. Transfer to the department of the contracts entered into by the department
10 of natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management functions which are in
11 effect on the effective date of this subdivision. If the transfer occurs, the department
12 shall carry out any obligations under such a contract until modified or rescinded by
13 the department to the extent allowed under the contract.

14 6. Transfer to the department of any rules promulgated or orders issued by the
15 department of natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management functions
16 which are in effect on the effective date of the plan. If the transfer occurs, any such
17 rules shall remain in effect until their specified expiration dates or until amended
18 or repealed by the department, and any such orders shall remain in effect until their
19 specified expiration dates or until modified or rescinded by the department.

20 7. Transfer to the department of any matter pending with the department of
21 natural resources relating to its vehicle fleet management functions. If the transfer
22 occurs, all materials submitted to or actions taken by the department of natural
23 resources with respect to the pending matter are considered as having been
24 submitted to or taken by the department.

1 (d) The department shall submit to the cochairpersons of the joint committee
2 on finance for consideration at the 3rd quarterly meeting of the committee under
3 section 13.10 of the statutes in the year 2000 an implementation plan for
4 consolidating the vehicle fleet management functions of the department of
5 transportation and the University of Wisconsin–Madison with the corresponding
6 functions of the department.

7 (e) The plan submitted under paragraph (d) may include provision for any of
8 the following on the effective date specified in the plan:

9 1. Transfer of the assets and liabilities of the department of transportation and
10 the University of Wisconsin–Madison relating to their vehicle fleet management
11 functions to the department.

12 2. Transfer of the tangible personal property, including records, of the
13 department of transportation and the University of Wisconsin–Madison to the
14 department.

15 3. Transfer to the department of any authorized full–time equivalent position
16 of the department of transportation or the board of regents of the University of
17 Wisconsin System relating to vehicle fleet management functions of the department
18 of transportation or the University of Wisconsin–Madison. The plan shall include
19 identification of the numbers, revenue sources and types of any positions to be
20 transferred from the department of transportation or the board of regents of the
21 University of Wisconsin System under the plan.

22 4. Transfer to the department of any incumbent employes holding positions at
23 the department of transportation or the University of Wisconsin–Madison relating
24 to vehicle fleet management functions. Employes transferred under the plan have
25 all the rights and the same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230

1 of the statutes that they enjoyed at the department of transportation or the
2 University of Wisconsin–Madison immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding
3 section 230.08 (4) of the statutes, no employee so transferred who has attained
4 permanent status in class is required to serve a probationary period.

5 5. Transfer to the department of the contracts entered into by the department
6 of transportation and the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System
7 relating to the vehicle fleet management functions of the department of
8 transportation and the University of Wisconsin–Madison which are in effect on the
9 effective date of this subdivision. If the transfer occurs, the department shall carry
10 out any obligations under such a contract until modified or rescinded by the
11 department to the extent allowed under the contract.

12 6. Transfer to the department of any rules promulgated or orders issued by the
13 department of transportation or the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin
14 System relating to the vehicle fleet management functions of the department of
15 transportation or the University of Wisconsin–Madison which are in effect on the
16 effective date of the plan. If the transfer occurs, any such rules shall remain in effect
17 until their specified expiration dates or until amended or repealed by the
18 department, and any such orders shall remain in effect until their specified
19 expiration dates or until modified or rescinded by the department.

20 7. Transfer to the department of any matter pending with the department of
21 transportation or the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin System relating
22 to the vehicle fleet management functions of the department of transportation or the
23 University of Wisconsin–Madison. If the transfer occurs, all materials submitted to
24 or actions taken by the department of transportation or the board of regents of the

1 University of Wisconsin System with respect to the pending matter are considered
2 as having been submitted to or taken by the department.

3 (f) The joint committee on finance may approve or modify and approve the plans
4 submitted under paragraphs (b) and (d). If the committee approves a plan, with or
5 without modifications, the department may implement the plan on the effective date
6 of the plan as specified in the plan. If the committee does not approve either plan, the
7 department shall not implement that plan.

8 (g) Notwithstanding section 16.42 of the statutes, the departments of natural
9 resources and transportation and the board of regents of the University of Wisconsin
10 System shall submit information under section 16.42 of the statutes for purposes of
11 the 2001–2003 biennial budget bill reflecting any savings incurred from
12 consolidation of vehicle fleet management functions as the result of implementation
13 of a plan under this subsection.

14 (h) The departments of natural resources and transportation and the board of
15 regents of the University of Wisconsin System shall fully cooperate with the
16 department in implementing any plan approved under paragraph (f).
