19 may include a requirement for an annual or other periodic audit of the project's
20 financial records.

21 6. The proceeds of the purchase will be used solely in connection with the costs
22 of the project.

23 7. The biotechnology company is able to manage its project responsibilities.

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1 (c) 1. The biotechnology development finance company may not own more than
2 49% of the voting stock or other interest in any enterprise as a result of a purchase
3 under par. (b).

4 2. The total investment by the biotechnology development finance company in
5 any one biotechnology company may not exceed \$200,000.

6 (d) The findings made by the biotechnology development finance company with
7 respect to whether a project meets the conditions under par. (b) 1. to 7. are conclusive.
